EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

In 2024, the Corona Fire Department achieved significant milestones in Emergency Management, strengthening community preparedness and resilience. In collaboration with the Corona Norco Unified School District, the department provided Teen CERT training to Santiago and Centennial high school students, equipping them with essential emergency response skills. A CERT Academy held in September saw residents graduate with critical disaster preparedness knowledge. To enhance the city's ability to manage large-scale incidents, Corona Fire also conducted a comprehensive full-scale Emergency Operations Center vegetation fire exercise, bringing together multiple agencies for coordinated emergency response training. Additionally, the department completed the FEMA-approved Local Hazard Mitigation Plan, outlining long-term strategies to reduce the city's risk from natural hazards, with the next update planned for 2028.

TOGETHER, WE'RE SAVING LIVES

In 2024, we responded to 11,673 medical response calls. Our paramedics saw 9,485 patients and provided Advanced Life Support to 2,905 patients. Of the total patients treated, 158 were treated for cardiac arrest. Thanks to our ongoing CPR program, our very own residents assisted in saving lives! Check out the numbers below:

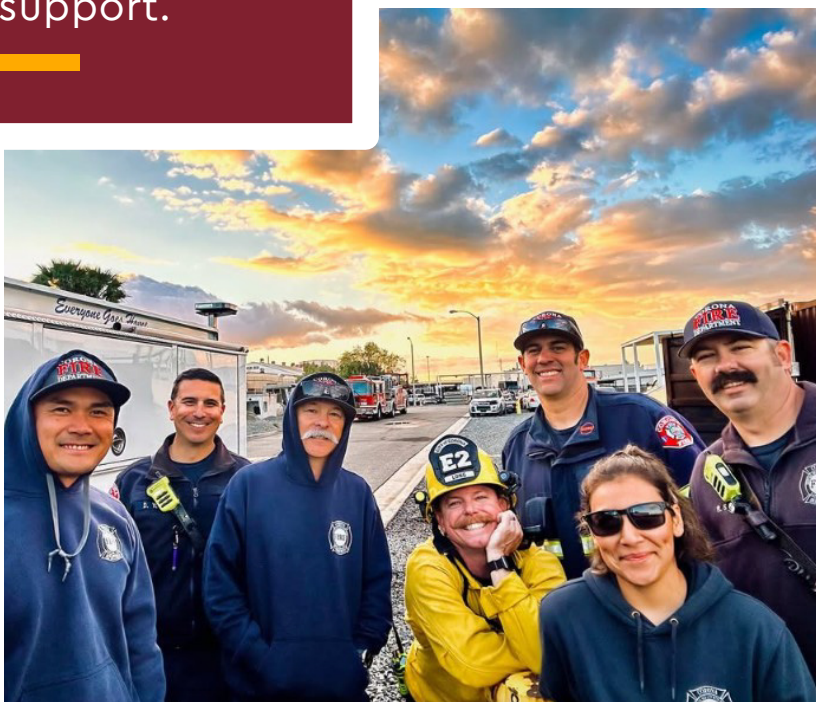
