## SCENE:

The initial surveillance of (SU) Santino Saputo began at RockeFellas Bar located at 21700 Temescal Canyon Road, in the unincorporated area of Corona, in the County of Riverside. The vehicle pursuit started in the City of Corona on the west side of the 76 Gas Station located at the 2500 block of Fashion Drive, Corona. The pursuit ended at the south east portion of the Encanto Apartments located at 4657 Temescal Canyon Road, Corona. Saputo fled on foot in the thick brush ravine just west of the Dos Logas Golf Course located at 4507 Cabot Drive, Corona. Saputo was taken into custody on the golf course. Photographs of the scene were taken by Corona PD's forensic unit.

## NOTE:

On 06-25-21, I was wearing a full Corona Police K9 uniform consisting of a vest carrier with visible POLICE letters attached to the front right chest and a cloth badge attached to the left chest. Attached to the back of the carrier is the word POLICE K9 in large silver letters. I was also driving a marked black and white Corona Police K9 unit 79299. My K9 partner Duke was wearing a green tactical K9 harness with POLICE written on both sides. This incident was captured by my patrol vehicle camera and my body worn Watch Guard camera.

## DETAILS:

On 06-25-21, at 1710 hours, Sgt. Bartlett called me on my cell phone requesting me to respond to the area of Temescal Canyon Road / I15 Freeway, in the unincorporated area of Corona in the County of Riverside to assist the Gang Task Force with a surveillance. Sgt. Bartlett told me (SU) Santino Renaldo Saputo had two confirmed felony warrants for his arrest. One felony warrant was for attempted murder involving a firearm (RIF2101872) and the second warrant was for selling and transporting a controlled substance (RIF2101672).

I was informed that GTF personnel had an active ping on Saputo's cellular phone which indicated Saputo was inside the Rockefeller Bar located at 21700 Temescal Canyon Road, in the unincorporated area of Corona, County of Riverside. Sgt. Bartlett parked his unmarked unit in the north parking lot at Rockefeller Bar and a second GTF member parked his unmarked unit in the south parking lot at Rockefeller Bar. I parked my unit and staged just north of Rockefeller Bar located at 21650 Temescal Canyon Road out of sight.

Prior to the surveillance, GTF members and I met in person and coordinated a plan if Saputo was seen exiting Rockefeller Bar. The plan was if an unmarked GTF member saw Saputo exit Rockefeller Bar we were going to approach Saputo and box him in the parking to prevent him from leaving in his vehicle and to prevent him from fleeing on foot back inside Rockefeller Bar. If Saputo was able to get into a vehicle and leave without us able to box him in, I was designated to conduct a traffic stop on his vehicle and perform a high risk vehicle stop.

During the surveillance, Sgt. Bartlett saw a Hispanic male adult wearing a black tank top who had tattoos on his arm which matched the physical description of Saputo. From where Sgt. Bartlett was positioned in the parking lot, he lost observations of Saputo and was not able to see if Saputo entered into a vehicle. Sgt. Bartlett also witnessed a second Hispanic male, later identified as (OT) [REDACTED], walking in the parking lot and got into the passenger seat of a grey Toyota Camry, CA license plate of 6TJC053. Since Sgt. Bartlett lost observations of Saputo, we as a team believed Saputo was the driver of this Camry. Sgt. Bartlett advised the Camry left the parking lot and was traveling northbound on Temescal Canyon Road.

I got behind the Camry at the intersection of Temescal Canyon Road / Dos Lagos, Corona. I was advised on the radio from GTF personnel to stop this vehicle due to Saputo being the driver. I switched my radio to Corona PD's primary radio channel and provided Corona PD's dispatch with the Camry's license plate. When the Camry made a left hand turn to go westbound on Dos Lagos Drive, I activated my Corona PD's marked black and white patrol vehicle's front and back red and blue lights which was at 19:10:39 hours. The Camry then made a right hand turn and continued to travel northbound behind the 76 Gas Station located at the 2500 block of Fashion Drive. I then activated my patrol vehicle's "Code 3" sirens. The Camry began to accelerate and I initiated a vehicle pursuit.

The Camry failed to stop at a posted stop sign just north of the 76 Gas Station at Fashion Drive in violation of 22450 CVC traveling approximately 15-20 miles per hour. The vehicle continued eastbound on Fashion Drive and failed to stop at the red traffic signal light at the intersection of Fashion Dr. / Temescal Canyon Road in violation of 21453(a) CVC. When the Camry failed to stop at this traffic signal light, the Camry was traveling approximately 40-50 miles per hour when it almost collided in to a vehicle which was traveling northbound on Temescal Canyon Road. The vehicle continued to drive eastbound and entered into the Encanto Apartments located at 4593 Temescal Canyon Road, Corona at a high rate of speed in violation of 22350 CVC. The Camry was traveling approximately 40-50 miles per hour while in the apartment complex. At 19:11:35 hours, the Camry stopped at a dead end at the furthest south-east portion of the apartment complex next to the 4657 building. The vehicle pursuit lasted approximately one minute and 54 seconds and the distance traveled was approximately .4 miles.

While driving up to the Camry, I saw Saputo exit out from the driver's seat of the Camry and flee on foot southbound towards a wrought iron gate. Saputo left the driver's door open. I

lost observations of Saputo; however, I believed Saputo jumped the fence just south of the Camry and continued to run southbound out of my sight. Once I parked my patrol vehicle, I got K9 Duke out from my vehicle for the following reasons:

1. Saputo had two confirmed felony warrants out for his arrest and one being attempted murder involving a firearm.
2. Saputo was now wanted per 2800.2(a) VC - Felony evading. During the pursuit, Saputo failed to stop at a posted stop sign, failed to stop at a traffic signal light, almost causing a traffic collision, and speeding through the Encanto Apartment Complex. Saputo was also wanted per 148(a)(1) PC - Resisting arrest.
3. It was unknown if Saputo had any weapons on his person due to him not being searched.
4. If the opportunity was presented, I was going to deploy K9 Duke to apprehend Saputo for the above listed reasons. I did not want Saputo to have the opportunity to get into an apartment and barricade himself, arm himself, or take an innocent bystander hostage.

I was not able to release K9 Duke from the front portion of my vehicle due to the Camry's driver's door being wide open and me knowing Cervantes was in the front passenger seat. So instead, I approached the Camry on the driver's side. During this time I pulled out my duty weapon and pointed it towards the direction of the Camry's interior and towards [REDACTED] who remained seated in the front passenger seat. I instructed [REDACTED] to stay in the vehicle and to keep his hands up in the air which [REDACTED] did. When additional GTF personnel arrived on scene, I instructed them to watch [REDACTED] so I could attempt to see where Saputo ran to. [REDACTED] was ultimately detained and placed in handcuffs without incident. I also requested on the radio for the Corona Fire Department to stage in the area in case an innocent bystander, officer or Saputo needed medical attention for any reason during the incident.

Although I never saw Saputo again, I yelled out for Saputo to stop running and to make himself known or he was going to get bit by my police dog; however, Saputo failed to comply with my commands and he never announced himself or showed himself. I chose not to place K9 Duke over the wrought iron fence for the following reasons:

1. To prevent any injuries on K9 Duke.
2. A GTF officer had jumped the fence and I did not want K9 Duke to mistake this officer as being a suspect.
3. I did not know if there were any homeless subjects in the ravine and I did not want K9 Duke to mistake them as being a suspect.
4. I did not want to lose sight of K9 Duke if he took off running. I also wanted to maintain physical control of K9 Duke. K9 Duke could have ran through the thick brush in the ravine and run onto the golf course. K9 Duke could have mistaken an innocent golfer as being a suspect.

Instead, I waited with other GTF members and officers for a pedestrian gate to be opened. Once the gate was opened, I again chose not to release K9 Duke to conduct a wind scent search for the above listed reasons. Riverside PD's airship, AIR1, was requested and they advised they were on their way. At this time, I knew additional Corona police officers were arriving on scene and multiple GTF members were in the ravine; however, I did not have visual of most of them due to the thick brush.

At 19:23:17 hours, I heard on the radio that Saputo was running eastbound on the Dos Lagos Golf Course located at 4507 Cabot Drive, Corona towards the direction of golfers. At 19:23:28 hours, I heard four gun shots; however, at this time I did not know where they were coming

from. At 19:23:48 hours, Sgt Waldon advised he was involved in an officer involved shooting and Saputo was now down on the ground. I was not able to cross the ravine with K9 Duke so I went back to my unit. My plan was to drive to the golf course and assist with arresting Saputo and to provide medical attention to him. Assisting officers advised on the radio Saputo was placed in handcuffs and at 1930 hours a tourniquet was applied on Saputo's left upper thigh.

I also heard on the radio that Corona Fire and AMR personnel were on scene at the golf course's club house. Assisting officers placed Saputo in the back seat of a patrol vehicle and drove Saputo to the club house where medical aid was provided.

I placed K9 Duke back in my patrol vehicle and began to place yellow caution tape in the area where the pursuit terminated, along the walkway near the ravine, and where Sgt Waldon was standing when the OIS occurred. I also located 3 of the 4 bullet casings on the ground in the dirt near where Sgt Waldon was standing. I folded two field interview cards and placed them next to the bullet casings to prevent any officer who walked in the crime scene from disturbing the casings. A GTF member was assigned to maintain observations of the casings.

Saputo was transported by AMR to Riverside Community Hospital for further medical treatment and for and ok to book. As of 6-26-21, at 2300 hours, Saputo was still at RCH recovering. An officer was assigned to be with Saputo and when the ok to book was completed, Saputo will be transported to RPDC for housing for the listed charges.

On 06-26-21, at approximately 2130 hours, I completed the CHP 187a form which is attached.

DETAILS:

On 06-25-21 at approximately 1911 hours, I began to respond to a pursuit that had been initiated by Officer Neff. It was advised over the radio that the occupant, (SU) Santino Saputo, was wanted for an attempted murder involving a firearm. While enroute it was advised that the male had began to run on foot east of the Encanto Apartment complex. I responded to the Dos Lagos golf course which is east of the Encanto Apartment complex.

Officer Cisco and I arrived at the front parking lot of the golf course and walked towards a ravine that separates the apartment complex and the golf course to help establish a perimeter. A few moments later it was broadcast on the radio that the male was running east across the golf course near golfers. RPD Air1 (police helicopter) arrived and advised the male was down near a golf cart on the far south side of the golf course. Officer Cisco and I began to move on foot to this location to assist in taking him into custody. As we got closer I saw RSO Deputy D. Miller approaching the male and handcuff him. Other assisting officers arrived.

The male was complaining of pain to his leg and his pants were saturated in a fluid. Believing the male had been shot in the right leg Officer Newell and I provided medical aid by applying a tourniquet to his leg. Other officers transported the male away via a police car in order to get him more medical aid.

Deputy Miller advised me that he had contacted four golfers who were nearby, but had not gotten statements from them. I contacted one of these golfers (WT) [REDACTED], the following is a summary of his BWC recorded statement. It should be noted that I called [REDACTED] on 06-26-21 at approximately 1925 hours to ask clarifying questions.

[REDACTED] said he and his friends were golfing at the golf course. [REDACTED] said he was standing at the bunker on the east of the sand pit looking to the west because he saw police officers walking around west of them. [REDACTED] said an officer (and pointed to Deputy Miller) asked them if they had seen anyone run through. [REDACTED] said he heard movement in the ravine as if someone was moving through the brush. [REDACTED] said approximately 5-7 minutes later he saw a male that he described as a hispanic in his late 20's with black medium length hair wearing a gold chain, black tank top and black shorts begin to run east from the ravine west of them. [REDACTED] said the man got within approximately 15 yards of one of his other friends. [REDACTED] said he saw the male reach his hands towards his pants in what he believed to be a gesture to pick up his sagging pants. [REDACTED] said it appeared that man was running towards a golf cart. [REDACTED] said he heard what he believed to be three gun shots and saw the man fall. [REDACTED] said he heard the helicopter order the man to stay down and the man did not get up. [REDACTED] said he saw an officer handcuff the male. [REDACTED] said he was scared during this incident because he "did not know if the man was armed or anything".

I was later advised by Cpl. Hubbard that the Pilot from the RPD Air1 had video of the incident and told me to meet them at the Corona airport. I responded to the Corona Airport and met with Police Officer Pilot J. Post, who provided me with a flash drive. I informed

Det. Larios that I had obtained the flash drive and she requested I view it and log it in. I watched the video which started with Santino already lying on the ground by a golf cart. The video then shows a deputy approach Santino and handcuff him. The video does not show anything prior to Santino lying in the same position that he was handcuffed. I logged the flash drive into evidence.

### DETAILS:

On 06-25-2021, at approximately 1911 hours, I was working uniformed patrol in the City of Corona County of Riverside. I responded to 4507 Cabot Dr. in the City of Corona County of Riverside to assist in an Officer-involved shooting.

For the reader's ease, I will refer to [REDACTED] as Wit-1 and [REDACTED] as Wit-2.

Upon arrival, I was tasked to interview witnesses that were still located on the scene. Wit-1 [REDACTED] met me by hole #12. The following is a summary of his statement:

[REDACTED] stated that on 06-25-2021, at approximately 1640 hours, a group of his friends and himself were at Dos Lagos Golf course preparing to Tee off. He stated that at approximately 1910 hours, while he was at what he believed was hole #13 or #15 of the course, he began noticing what seemed to be at the time people playing "Airsoft." [REDACTED] then got a closer observation and realized that the person that was walking towards him was a Police Officer asking if he saw anyone run by. He was able to identify that he was a police officer from the marked "Police" logo on the vest of the officer. [REDACTED] then began watching his friend continue to play Golf when he noticed the suspect, later identified as Santino Saputo, come out of the bush running eastbound onto the course towards their golf carts that were parked just east of them. He described Santino as a Hispanic male that was wearing a black tank top and baggy tan shorts. [REDACTED] then began pointing towards Santino to notify the Police Officers in the area of his location.

Hole #12 is elevated and has a steep downhill depression on the north side of the hole near the green area. [REDACTED] stated he observed Santino run in-between their golf carts, then heard what he believes was 6 to 10 gunshots and observed Santino drop to the ground and clinch his legs. [REDACTED] heard the Police helicopter giving commands to Santino but could not clearly determine what was being said other than "layout flat." [REDACTED] mentioned as soon as he heard the gunshots he dropped to the ground and remained in a prone position. He could not determine how many police officers were at the incident but did recollect that multiple officers were arresting Santino then providing medical aid. [REDACTED] did not know where the shots came from and did not see who shot Santino. [REDACTED] observed several police officers walking and a police vehicle approaching Santino then taking him into custody. [REDACTED] said due

to the baggy clothing Santino was wearing, he could not determine if he was armed but believed he was due to police following him.

After concluding my interview with [REDACTED] I then interviewed [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement:

[REDACTED] stated on 06-25-2021, at approximately 1633 hours, himself and a group of his friends ([REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED]) were playing golf at Dos Lagos Golf Course. At approximately 1830 hours, he stated they were at hole #12, located in the southeast corner of the golf course. He stated he was driving one of the golf carts approaching hole #12 when he saw multiple police officers inside the bushes southwest of his location. Prior to arriving at hole #12 [REDACTED] stated he heard sirens in the distance but did not realize how close they were. [REDACTED] knew they were police officers based on the vests they were wearing with "POLICE" written on the back. [REDACTED] stated he began walking towards the green area of the hole and towards his friends who were on the green getting ready to play the hole. He observed 3 to 4 uniformed police officers searching throughout the bushes, and one officer asked them if they have seen anyone run through the area they were at. [REDACTED] said "no" and continued to play golf as the officers continued their search. [REDACTED] stated his friend [REDACTED] started yelling, "he's right here," and observed a male exit the bush area and began running in an eastbound direction towards their parked golf carts. [REDACTED] described Santino as a mid-aged middle eastern male wearing a black tank top, black baggy shorts with black hair, and a black beard. [REDACTED] was unable to determine if Santino was armed or carrying any weapon. [REDACTED] stated he was standing directly next to the hole, then heard 3 to 4 gunshots and after a few seconds realized they were gunshots then immediately dropped to the ground assuming a prone position. [REDACTED] observed Santino lying on the ground near the parked golf carts from the prone position, pointing at his leg, implying that he was shot. Approximately 5 minutes after he observed two officers walking in an eastbound direction towards Santino, taking him into custody. [REDACTED] stated that was all he observed during this incident.

**NOTE:**

The purpose of this supplemental report is to provide additional information regarding the listed the case number. The following is a summary of my involvement during the incident.

**DETAILS:**

On Friday, 06-25-21, at about 1911 hours, I (Officer K. Newell) heard K9 Officer Neff broadcast that he was in vehicle pursuit of an attempt murder suspect. The pursuit went into the Encanto Apartments off Temescal Canyon Rd. (in the City of Corona, County of Riverside), then I heard K9 Officer Neff broadcast that the suspect had foot bailed from the vehicle and was fleeing on foot. It should be noted that the Encanto Apartments are next the to the Dos Lago's golf course.

I responded to the incident to assist with containing and apprehending the suspect. As I arrived on scene, and was seeking a perimeter location, I heard radio broadcasts that the suspect was running E/B through the golf course towards golfers. I then heard that an officer shooting had occurred, and the suspect was down on the golf course.

I responded to the club house of Dos Lago's golf course and was ultimately able to obtain a golf cart. Using the golf cart, Corporal M. Rodriguez and I proceeded onto the golf course and towards the downed suspect (offender-Santino Saputo). As we reached Santino, he had already been handcuffed and taken into custody by assisting law enforcement personnel (i.e., a Gang Task Force Officer). Corona PD Officer S. Hungerford was also present and was requesting a tourniquet be placed on Santino's right leg due to sustaining a gun shot wound. I used my CAT tourniquet, placed it high up on Santino's right leg (close to his hip), and applied the tourniquet.

Due to being in the middle of the golf course, Santino was placed into the backseat of a Corona Police Department patrol vehicle so he could he be transported to the clubhouse. Corona Fire Department personnel were waiting at the clubhouse to provide medical treatment to Santino. I sat it the backseat of the patrol vehicle with Santino to monitor him as he was transported to the clubhouse by Corona PD Detective M. Placencia and Corporal R. Hubbard.

After transporting Santino to the clubhouse, I was directed to respond to the location where the vehicle pursuit terminated, and Santino fled on foot. This was near 4657 Temescal Canyon Rd. in the Encanto apartment complex. I was directed by Corona PD Sgt. Bartlett to start and maintain a crime scene log. I started the crime scene log at about 1955 hours.

From about 1955 hours on 06-25-21, until about 0622 hours on 06-26-21, I maintained the crime scene log and provided scene security until I was relieved by Corona PD Officer E. Banuelos. At which time he transferred the crime scene log to Officer E. Banuelos.

During our search K9 Bruce located a bandana that was approximately 40 feet south of the termination of the pursuit just outside the wrought iron fence of the Encanto Apartments. The bandana was later recovered in the approximate area it was located by Detective Edwards. We did not locate any other items during our search.

**PURPOSE:**

This supplemental report documents the crime scene around the Encanto Apartments in the 4500 blk of Temescal Canyon Rd., Corona, CA.

**SCENE:**

The Encanto Apartments is a gated community located at 4593 Temescal Canyon Rd., Corona, CA. The front entrance gate was locked open when I arrived. The suspect vehicle was parked in the roadway facing south at 4657 Temescal Canyon Rd. Sgt. Waldon's police vehicle was parked at 4597 Temescal Canyon Rd. facing east. An orange arrow was found just east of 4653 Temescal Canyon Rd., #102. See details for further information.

**ASSISTING PERSONNEL:**

Det. J. Marquez- Documented golf course scene.  
Officer S. Velasco- Documented suspect vehicle search.  
Officer R. Romans- FARO scene diagraming.

**NOTE:**

This crime scene was broken up into three parts due to its large size. I documented in this report the Encanto Apartments scene. Det. J. Marquez documented the golf course scene and finally, Officer S. Velasco documented the search and scene of the suspect vehicle.

**DETAILS:**

On 06-25-2021 at about 1940 hours, I responded to the Corona Police Department reference an officer-involved shooting. Upon arrival, Sr. Det. Garcia assigned Det. J. Marquez and I handle the crime scene of the incident. I attended the briefing at Dos Lagos Golf Course where I was notified that the officer shot from the Encanto Apartments.

Sgt. Bartlett and Riverside County Sheriff Deputy Miller gave investigators a walk-thru of the scene starting with the Encanto Apartments side of the scene. Officer Newell had secured the scene covering the roadway of 4500 blk of Temescal Canyon Rd. Officer Buonarigo secured the sidewalk area just east of the 4500 Blk of Temescal Canyon Rd (shooting area).

As I surveyed the scene I could see in the road at 4657 Temescal Canyon Rd. there were four vehicles on the road facing south: A gray Dodge Durango (5SFL342, CA/ Police vehicle), brown Ford Crown Victoria 11-070 (1369017, CA/ Police vehicle), black and white Corona Police vehicle 79299 (1554171 CA) which had all of its code 3 lights activated. Then finally there was a gray Toyota Camry (6TJJC053, CA). The Toyota had both driver-side front and passenger-side front doors open. The vehicle was turned on. I noticed a cellular phone on the concrete just outside of the passenger side door.

I was notified that the suspect had run through a green belt garden area and jumped a wrought iron fence which he ran into a swamp area that leads to the golf course. Due to hazards, I was not able to search the swamp area, Det. G. Edwards searched the area the next day, see his supplemental report for details.

I further walked down a sidewalk path that was just east of 4653 Temescal Canyon Rd., #102, Corona, CA. where I saw an orange arrow on the sidewalk that pointed in a S/E direction. I was notified (by Marquez) that Sgt. Waldon used spray chalk to paint this arrow

for where he was standing and in what direction he shot. Just south of the orange arrow in the planter (bushes) area, I located 4 cartridge cases (5.56).

I further walked to where Sgt. Waldon's Corona Police vehicle (S79294, 1532642 CA.) was parked at 4597 Temescal Canyon Rd. The vehicle was parked on the road facing east. The vehicle's doors were locked and the code 3 lights were activated.

I instructed Forensic Tech. L. Walker to take photographs of in and outside of all police vehicles. The suspect vehicle was photographed on the outside only. I also had her photograph and yellow placard all evidence items and overall scene photographs. Officer R. Romans then used the FARO to diagram the scene.

Walker then collected the following items:

- iPhone (cellular phone) next to suspect vehicle (passenger side concrete).
- Four 5.56 cartridge casings.

The search team conducted an article search in the creek area located behind the Encanto Apartment Complex. That area has thick vegetation with a creek running through the middle and the Dos Lagos Golf Course is located to the east of the area. The team accessed the creek area through a pedestrian gate located just east of 4657 Temescal Canyon Rd. Corona. The team searched south from the pedestrian gate, then westbound adjacent to 4657 Temescal Canyon Rd. Corona. The team then continued south to the Creekside Mobile Estates located at 21650 Temescal Canyon Rd., then east again toward the Dos Lagos Golf Course. After completing the search behind the Encanto Apartment Complex (west of the creek) the team relocated to the Dos Lagos Golf Course, located at 4507 Cabot Drive, Corona. The team searched the other side of the creek area starting from the area northwest of hole #12, going south and finishing southwest of hole #12. See attached map labeled "Edwards article search" (uploaded to Flex) for further details regarding the article search scene.

**Details:**

On 6-26-21, at approximately 0830 hours, the article search team met in the parking lot of 4657 Temescal Canyon Road to conduct an article search for any evidence regarding this case. Officer Kelly and his K9 partner Bruce were utilized to assist in the article search.

During the search, a blue bandana was located approximately 45 feet south of 4657 Temescal Canyon Rd. Corona. The bandana was south of the wrought iron fence that separates the apartment complex and the creek area. The bandana was in bushes at the location. The bandana was clean and had no mud or other debris which led me to believe the bandana had not been in the creek area for an extended amount of time.

I photographed the bandana and the area it was located. I then collected the bandana and later logged it into evidence at Corona PD. The photographs I took were uploaded to DigitalOnQ.

The article search was concluded around 1030 hours, and no other items were located. See Officer Kelly's supplemental report for details regarding the use of the police K9 during the search.

This supplemental report was prepared by Sergeant Bartlett.

**NOTE:**

\*I have been a sworn police officer in the State of California since 2008. Prior to becoming a sworn police officer, I attended the San Bernardino Sheriff's Basic Academy. During the sheriff's academy, topics were presented that covered the areas of drugs, drug packaging and signs and symptoms of being under the influence. After graduating the academy, I successfully completed a field training program. During the field training program, I was apart of numerous drug and gang related investigations. I have since been assigned as a patrol officer, K9 handler, corporal, field training officer, defensive tactics instructor, special response team member, field sergeant, relief watch commander and most recently as the supervisor of the Corona/Jurupa Valley Regional Gang Task Force. During that time, I have attended numerous classes that cover the areas of drugs, case law and gangs. I have been a part of numerous drug related investigations to include drug possession, drug sales, transportation and under the influence.

\*In May of 2021, the Region Four Gang Task Force requested assistance in the service of a search warrant. On the day of the search warrant service, Region 7 Gang Task Force Officers Medeiros (Corona PD), Officer Rivero (CHP), Corporal Ramirez (RSO), and Sergeant Bartlett (CPD), met with Region 4 GTF officers and were briefed on the circumstances surrounding the search warrant. The following is a summary of those circumstances: Region 4 GTF was investigating a gang related shooting where suspects reportedly shot at a gang member from the City of Ontario. The suspects involved in the shooting were believed to be members of the criminal street gang, Corona Varrio Locos. The weapon involved was reported to be a rifle. Suspects were identified, including Santino Saputo. After the Riverside Sheriff's SWAT team served the warrant and deemed the location safe, a search was conducted. During the service of the search warrant, multiple firearms, including a rifle, were located in Saputo's room along with narcotics. As the search warrant was being served, Saputo arrived back to the location and led Riverside Sheriffs Personnel on a pursuit. Region 7 GTF Officers assisted in the perimeter of the area where the pursuit ended. A search was conducted by SWAT and Saputo was located and taken into custody. See Region Four GTF's initial report for further information (Case: F211250019).

On 6/25/21 I was working as a Sergeant for the Corona/Jurupa Valley Gang Task Force Region 7. The following is a summary of the events that occurred on 6/25/21:

At approximately 1600 hours, a request was made by Deputy Tuly of the Temecula/Murrieta Gang Task Force Region 4 to assist them in the location and apprehension of Santino Saputo who had an active attempted murder (PC 664/187) warrant. Deputy Tuly tracked Saputo to the area of Magnolia Ave/Jackson St, Riverside. Deputy Miller of Region 4 GTF emailed me a copy of the operations plan for me to review prior to our arrival in Riverside. In the operation plan, Saputo's Criminal history was listed for officer safety and include:

[REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED].

At approximately 1628 hours, after arriving in the Riverside area, I contacted Corona Dispatch and advised them of our location, suspect name and that he had a felony warrant. A short time later, Saputo was tracked to the area of Temescal Canyon Road/15 Freeway.

While enroute to the updated location, I contacted Corona Dispatch and provided them with the updated information and informed them that Saputo's warrant was for 664/187. I then made notification to Lt. Edward's due to the proximity to the City of Corona.

Due to the nature of the warrant, I requested Corona K9 Officer Neff respond to the location to assist. See Officer Neff's report for further information. Once Saputo was determined to be at Rockefellas Bar, located at 21700 Temescal Canyon Road, the decision was made to have one two-man GTF Unit in the south parking lot for observation, one two-man GTF Unit south of the location to contact Saputo or conduct a traffic stop, and a two-man GTF Unit and K9 Officer Neff north of the location to contact Saputo or conduct a traffic stop. I was parked north of Rockafellas bar in an adjoining parking lot for observation. See Officer Neff's report for further information.

While observing the north side parking lot of Rockafellas, I observed a subject who matched the description of Saputo. I watched as the male walked east through the parking lot out of my view. I later observed a second Hispanic male with a large tattoo across his throat, later identified as Thomas Cervantes walking east through the parking lot. A short time later, I observed a grey Toyota Camry drive westbound through the parking lot and park in a handicap parking space near the west facing entrance. I observed Cervantes exit the passenger side of the vehicle and walk back into Rockafellas. Cervantes exited Rockafellas a short time later and entered the front passenger seat of the same Toyota Camry. The vehicle then exited the parking lot and drove north on Temescal Canyon Road.

I updated Officer Neff on the direction of travel of the vehicle. A short time later, deputies confirmed that Saputo was in the vehicle. Officer Neff then attempted a traffic stop with the two-man unit of GTF Region 7 Corporal Ramirez and Officer Rivero behind him. The vehicle failed to yield, and a pursuit was initiated. See Officer Neff's report for further information.

When I arrived at the conclusion of the pursuit, I met officers along the east fence line separating the residential area from the golf course. I was advised that Saputo was last seen running eastbound into a densely wooded area down into a ravine.

While walking southeast along the ravine, I heard that a box possibly containing narcotics was located in the area Saputo was last thought to be. At approximately 10:59 minutes of my BWC footage, I broadcast via my radio that I observed Saputo running eastbound across the golf course passing golfers. Immediately after my radio broadcast, I heard what I thought to be gunfire from an unknown location. At approximately 11:51 minutes of my BWC I requested medical to stage.

Searching officers immediately began looking for a path that led to the location of Saputo. At approximately 15:52 minutes of my BWC footage, officers can be heard via the radio taking Saputo into custody.

After Saputo was taken into custody, I contacted Officer Rivero and Corporal Ramirez who had Cervantes detained outside of the vehicle. Based on the following circumstances, I believed it was probable that Saputo and Cervantes were involved in, or conspired to sale narcotics, or destroy/hide the narcotics once the traffic stop was initiated.

\* Prior to locating Saputo at Rockafellas, Saputo was tracked to the area of Magnolia/Jackson St, Riverside. I learned later that night that Cervantes lives at 3626 Jackson St #A Riverside, which led me to believe that Saputo was with Cervantes at his residence prior to Rockafellas.

\* Saputo and Cervantes are believed to be associated with the same criminal street gang Corona Varrio Locos. \*Gangs often use the sales of narcotics to fund criminal activity.

\* Saputo and Cervantes were together at Rockefellas prior to the pursuit and attempted destruction of suspected narcotics by Saputo.

\* Cervantes was seen exiting the passenger seat of the car driven by Saputo, which Saputo parked in a handicap stall near the front door of the bar. Cervantes quickly entered the bar and exited a short time later. \*It is not uncommon for drug dealers to keep their narcotics in a separate location other than their person, only to retrieve the drugs prior to or immediately after a drug transaction.

\* Cervantes was in the vehicle during the vehicle pursuit.

\* The box of suspected narcotics found in the location Saputo was believed to be hiding.

\* Suspecting that the box of narcotics was in the vehicle with both Saputo and Cervantes, prior to Saputo fleeing from the vehicle.

\* Cervantes being in possession of over \$2,000 dollars of US currency.

I learned later that night, that Saputo was also in possession of a large sum of US currency.

Cervantes was arrested and later transported to the Corona Police Jail by Corporal Jolin for the crime of 182(a)(5) PC (conspire to commit any act injurious to the public health, public morals, or to pervert or obstruct justice, or the due administration of laws).

While at the Corona Police Station, Corona Police Detectives interviewed Cervantes. The following is a summary of that interview: Cervantes stated he was at the bar for a short time after meeting his boss. When he left, he was given a ride by Saputo. Once in the car, Cervantes fell asleep and only woke up when contacted by officers. See detectives report for more information.

Cervantes was ultimately released from the Corona Police Jail per 849(b)(1) PC.

The box of narcotics located in the area Saputo was last believed to be in was locked. Even though the box was locked, officers were able to see what appeared to be a large amount of white powdery substance inside. From my training and experience and Cervantes and Saputo's criminal history, I believe the substance to be narcotics. Due to being unable to open the box, the substance was not tested or weighed. See Officer Ramirez' report.

Detectives were notified and will be conducting further investigation.

Tarrant

On 06-25-21 at approximately 2145 hours, I responded to the Corona Police Department Traffic Conference room reference an officer (Sgt. J. Waldon from Corona PD) that needed to be charted after a critical incident.

Injuries

Sgt. Waldon did not have any visible injuries and did not have any complaints of pain.

Uniform

Sgt. Waldon was wearing a CPD Class B uniform; a long sleeve dark blue uniform that has Corona Police Patches on both shoulders. The front of the uniform has a metal badge over the left chest area. Sgt Waldon had a CPD issued patrol rifle slung to his right side

Gear

On Sgt. Waldon's uniform, I located keys, a notepad, and gloves in his pockets. In Sgt. Waldon's belt, I located the following items.

- \* Two H&K factory 9mm 15 round magazines. Both magazines were filled to capacity with 9mm hollow-point rounds, stamped "WIN 9mm Luger".

- \* One can of Saber Red OC spray, which appeared to have OC inside, and was in good condition.

- \* One Watchguard BWC.

- \* One Harris radio with lapel mic attached.

- \* One RCB (rapid containment baton) in working order.

- \* Two Pairs of handcuffs.

- \* One Safariland level II holster with an H&K USP 9mm handgun in it.

Weapons

Located in the above-listed holster with two levels of retention activated. I found an H&K USP 9mm handgun serial number 24-061537. The weapon is equipped with a Surefire X300 weapon light, which was in working order at the time of inspection. The iron sights were visible and had glowing inserts. The weapon was in battery, a round was in the chamber, and a magazine was inserted. I ejected the magazine and noticed it was a factory H&K USP 9mm 15 round magazine. The magazine had 15 9mm hollow-point rounds in it. The rounds were marked WIN 9mm Luger. I locked the firearm slide to the rear, and one 9mm hollow-point round marked WIN 9mm Luger was ejected from the chamber. There was a total of 16 rounds in the weapon. The weapon is equipped with a safety/ de-cocker on the left and side of the frame. The weapon was on safe at the time of charting. The safety features on the weapon appeared to be in good working order, and all functioned as designed.

I took possession of Sgt. Waldon's patrol rifle. The rifle was stamped COLT M4LE, serial number LE081003. The rifle selector switch was on safe with the dust cover open. I ejected the 30 round Magpul magazine from the weapon and located 23 5.56mm Winchester 77 grain hollow point rounds in it (it is taught, and a general practice to load the magazines to 28 rounds). The rounds were all stamped WMA 15. The rifle is equipped with an Aim Point Pro red dot optic. The optic was on and in working order at the time of inspection. The rifle is also equipped with a fixed front sight and flip-up rear sights. The rear flip-up sight was in the down position. The rifle is equipped with a one-point sling. The rifle also is equipped with

a vertical foregrip. The rifle had a Surefire X300 weapon light, which was in working order at the time of inspection. The rifle is equipped with a CPD owned and issued OSS suppressor, which appeared to be in working order at the time of inspection.

These were the only two weapons located on Sgt. Waldon's person at the time of charting.

DOJ

On 07-02-2021, at approximately 1300 hours, I responded to the Department of Justice (DOJ) office located in Riverside, CA. I submitted the rifle, magazine, and 24 rounds to be tested by DOJ (see Tarrant-DOJ physical evidence Submission Form in Spillman)

On 07-09-2021, at approximately 1300 hours, I responded to Riverside DOJ. I collected all the items submitted to DOJ and responded to the Corona Police Range, where I completed a POST shooting weapon inspection on Sgt. Waldon's weapon (see Tarrant - POST shooting inspection form in Spillman). The firearm was in good working order. All internal and external safeties were working as designed. All internal parts were in good working order and did not show any signs of excessive wear or damage. I noticed the firing pin had significant protrusion to strike a primer of a loaded round. I did not test-fire the weapon.

I secured the rifle, magazine, and all rounds collected until Sgt. Waldon was able to retrieve them.

INCIDENT RECORDED ON BODY/DASHBOARD CAMERA: YES

EVIDENCE: Dictionary with hollowed out center with a locked safe inside.

DETAILS:

On 06/25/2021, at approximately 1900 hours, CHP Officer Rivero and I were assigned to work as members of the Regional Gang Task Force (GTF)/ Region 07, assigned to the Cities of Corona/ Jurupa Valley/ Eastvale/ Norco and Riverside County areas surrounding these cities. We were riding together inside a brown Riverside County Sheriff's Department Ford Crown Victoria vehicle that is equipped with red and blue emergency lights, a siren, a driver and passenger side spotlights, and a front push bumper bar.

On this date and time members of GTF were assisting GTF Region 04 with the apprehension of Santino Saputo for a Felony Arrest 664/187 (a) PC -Attempt Murder warrant. Saputo was believed to be visiting at Rockefellas Bar located at 21700 Temescal Canyon Road, Corona CA.

At about 1910 hours, Corona PD Officer Neff drove behind a dark colored Toyota Camry that Saputo was believed to be riding inside. The Toyota drove to and stopped for a solid red light in the left-hand turn lane of Temescal Canyon Road and Dos Lagos Drive. The light turned green and the Toyota made a left-hand turn onto Dos Lagos Drive. Officer Neff activated his emergency lights and the Toyota made a right-hand turn onto the first road and increased its velocity northbound. Suspecting the Toyota was not going to stop, and to protect the motorists on the road, I activated my emergency lights and siren as required by state law. The Toyota turned right onto Fashion Drive and proceeded eastbound. The Toyota drove through a red light at the intersection of Fashion Drive and Temescal Canyon Road and entered the Encanto Apartments. The Toyota continued to travel at a high rate of speed through the apartment complex, and I lost sight of it momentarily for about 5 seconds. I saw the Toyota stopped near Apartment # 4657. Officer's Neff's vehicle was parked behind the Toyota, and I saw the Toyota's driver's door open. I deactivated my lights and siren, and learned the driver, Santino Saputo had fled on foot in a South East direction. The Toyota was occupied by front seated passenger Thomas Cervantes. Officer Rivero detained Cervantes, and I ran to the south east corner of the apartment complex to assist officer's in locating and arresting Saputo.

Believing Saputo ran into a nearby narrow gorge that separated the apartment complex and a golf course, members of GTF entered the gorge to look for Saputo. As I was following CHP Officer Thomas down a path we believed Saputo had run through, I observed Officer Thomas to locate and pickup a Dictionary. I saw Officer Thomas open the dictionary and saw the center of it had been hollowed out, and a lock box was concealed inside. We continued to look for Saputo inside the gorge for several minutes. As we were inside the gorge, I heard approximately 4-gun shots. Not knowing where the shots came from, I returned to the apartment complex and was informed an officer involved shooting had occurred. Officer Thomas gave me the dictionary and I secured it inside my patrol vehicle. I returned to my vehicle and saw Cervantes had been detained inside the backseat. I had him exit the vehicle so that I could remove all the items out of his pockets. I saw he had over \$2,000 dollars in his wallet and pant pocket.

I was instructed by Corona Police Sergeant Bartlett to protect the area where the officer involved shooting took place, and to fill out a crime scene log. I remained at the area until relieved by Officer Bounorigo.

I arrived at the Corona Police Station to book the Dictionary into evidence. The box inside the dictionary was locked. I pulled its handle and was able to partially see inside the box.

I saw several clear plastic baggies and a white crystal-like substance inside the box. Because the box was locked, I was unable to retrieve the items from within to test and weigh.

With my training and experience I believed the crystal-like substance to be methamphetamine. Officer Medeiros assisted me in booking in the dictionary with the locked box inside.

**DETAILS:** On Friday 06-25-2021 at around 1941 hours, I received a telephone message from the Corona Police Department requesting me to respond to the Corona Police Department reference an officer involved shooting. I arrived at the Corona Police Department on 06-25-2021 at around 2115 hours and contacted Forensic Technician L. Walker. After Forensic Technician Walker completed the charting process of Sergeant J. Waldon, we responded to Dos Lagos Golf Course (4507 Cabot Drive, Corona, CA). Upon arrival we contacted the Officer Involved Shooting Investigation Team and conducted a walk through of the scene located at the Encanto Apartments (4593 Temescal Canyon Road, Corona, CA).

After our walk through of the scene, Detective M. Placencia advised me to take overall photographs of Corona Police Department Officer E. Harryman. I photographed Officer Harryman in the Corona Police Department Traffic Division trailer which was located in the parking lot of Dos Lagos Golf Course (see photographs CPD\_0001-CPD\_0012). After photographing Officer Harryman, Senior Detective G. Gottfried requested I respond to Riverside Community Hospital (4445 Magnolia Avenue, Riverside, CA) to photograph and collect a Gunshot Residue (GSR) Evidence Kit from suspect Santino Saputo (04-27-93).

I arrived at Riverside Community Hospital on Saturday 06-26-21 at around 0045 hours and contacted Corona Police Department Officer M. Medeiros at emergency room #36. Officer Medeiros advised me Saputo's clothing and property were in plastic bags, located on the floor near the doorway of emergency room #36. Per Senior Detective Gottfried's request, I took overview and close-up photographs of Saputo including injuries I could visibly see on Saputo's legs and left shoulder. I was unable to photograph all of Saputo's body because he was intubated, sedated, and had a soft cast on his lower right leg and foot (see photographs CPD\_0013-CPD\_0079).

After photographing Saputo, I collected a Gunshot Residue (GSR) Evidence Kit from Saputo's right and left hand. I listed the GSR kit as evidence item PD1. I then collected three, clear, plastic bags containing Saputo's clothing and property from the doorway. The following is a list of items that were located in the plastic bags, which I later listed as evidence items PD2-PD10:

Item PD2: (01) Pair of black, Neoblue, cargo shorts, size 32 with black belt.

Item PD2(A): (02) Lottery tickets "Silver Gold" and "Red Hot 10's" collected from left rear pocket of item PD2.

Item PD3: (01) Black, Shaka, tank top, size large.

Item PD4: (01) Pair of black, Knocker, boxer briefs, size small 30-32.

Item PD5: (02) Gray socks with black stitched marijuana leaves.

Item PD6: (02) Black, Vans shoes, size 10 (left and right shoe).

Item PD7: (01) Black, Positive Resources Inc, Velcro tourniquet.

Item PD8: (01) 24" yellow metal necklace.

Item PD9: (01) Black metal smoking pipe.

Item PD10: \$601 U.S. currency (cash).

After collecting Saputo's clothing and property, I transported evidence items PD1-PD10 to the Corona Police Department Forensic Laboratory for further processing. Saputo's clothing was wet so I allowed it to dry out in the forensic laboratory prior to processing. On Tuesday 06-29-2021, I processed evidence items PD2-PD10 in the forensic laboratory. Prior to processing the evidence I visually examined each item and took overview and close-up photographs.

Item PD2 (black cargo shorts with black belt) were cut in several pieces. I located a hole on the flap of the left leg cargo pocket and two holes on the right leg, below the right cargo pocket. I labeled the hole on the flap of the left cargo pocket as "A" and the two holes on the right leg as "B" and "C" as a visual aide and took overview and close-up photographs. I also located two, scratched, lottery tickets in the left, rear pocket. I removed the lottery tickets from the shorts and listed them as evidence item PD2(A) (see photographs CPD\_0080-CPD\_0135 for items PD2 and PD2(A)).

The front of item PD3 (black tank top) was cut from top to bottom. I located a hole on the front of the shirt near the middle of the shirt. I labeled the hole as "A" as a visual aide and took overview and close-up photographs (see photographs CPD\_0136-CPD\_0153). The back of item PD4 (black boxer briefs) were cut from top to bottom. I located one hole on the front of boxer briefs near the fly and two groups of holes on the right leg. I labeled the hole near the fly as "A" and labeled the two groups of holes on the right leg as "B" and "C" as a visual aide and took overview and close-up photographs (see photographs CPD\_0154-CPD\_0177). I also took overview and close-up photographs of items PD5-PD10 (see photographs CPD\_0178-CPD\_0198).

I took a total of (198) photographs and listed the photographs as evidence item PD11. I logged evidence items PD1-PD11 with the Corona Police Department Property Section. I uploaded item PD11 into Digital On Q and I uploaded my property report (21-34352 De La Hoya Property Report\_1) into Spillman as an attachment to this supplemental report. Refer to Officer Roman's supplemental report for a diagram of the scene and Forensic Technician Walker's supplemental report for additional evidence collection.

### Training and Experience:

I have been employed by the Corona Police Department since 2013. I worked uniformed patrol for 5 years and am currently assigned to Region 7 of the Riverside Sheriff's Department's Gang Task Force (GTF). When assigned to Patrol, I handled hundreds of preliminary investigations including narcotics, assaults, theft, robbery, burglary, forgery, carjacking's, and embezzlement. I currently have more than 100 college units in general education, criminal justice, and sociology related courses taken at the California State University of San Marcos.

In January 2019, I was assigned to the Vice / Narcotics / Gang and Intelligence team (VNGI) at the Corona Police Department. While assigned to VNGI, I have taken part in investigations related to the sale of narcotics, transportation of narcotics, cultivation of marijuana, and handling informants. During my tenure with the Corona Police Department, I have received continuing education in the areas of firearms, use of force, SFSTs, asset forfeiture, informant management, gangs, interview/interrogation, and search warrant preparation. During my tenure I have made more than 100 arrests related to the use, possession, or sale of narcotics (to include marijuana, methamphetamine, ecstasy, and heroin). As a police officer I have talked to narcotic users, sellers, and reliable confidential informants. While speaking with these people I have gained an understanding of how narcotics are used, packaged for sale, and the typical habits of those who sell and use narcotics.

I was employed by the Riverside Sheriff's Department from 2010-2013. While working for the Riverside Sheriff's Department, I was assigned to the Robert Presley Detention Center. While at the Robert Presley Detention Center, I worked in the transportation department, floor operations, and was a member of the Emergency Response Team (ERT). While working at the Robert Presley Detention Center, I frequently booked and dealt with people who used narcotics including; cocaine, heroin, methamphetamine, and marijuana.

Prior to working for the Riverside Sheriff's Department, I attended the 183rd Basic Academy at the Ben Clark Training Center in Riverside Ca. While in the 183rd Basic Academy, I received numerous hours of training on various law enforcement related topics including theft, computer crimes, child abuse, grand theft auto, evidence collection, narcotics, assaults, theft, robbery, burglary, forgery, and embezzlements. During the academy, I received training in the field of narcotics (marijuana, methamphetamine, cocaine, heroin, ecstasy and others). During this training I learned about the typical amount of each drug is used at a time, how it is packaged, and how it is sold.

### Details:

On 07-07-2021, Senior Detective Gottfried contacted me reference conducting testing of possible narcotic related evidence recovered at the scene of the initial incident. The original evidence item was logged in under item "VR01" by Corporal Ramirez from Region 7 of the Riverside County Gang Task Force. I conducted the evidence testing at the Corona Police Department.

Using the Corona PD TruNarc narcotics analyzer, I tested the contents of each evidence item containing possible illegal narcotics. The Thermo Scientific TruNarc Handheld Narcotics Analyzer is a handheld Raman device that identifies multiple controlled substances including

narcotics, synthetic drugs, cutting agents, and precursor chemicals in a single test, without direct contact for most samples.

The following are the results of the analysis:

Based on my training and experience, I know the Thermo Scientific TruNarc Handheld Narcotics Analyzer only tests a small portion of particular item. If an item is mixed or cut with a cutting agent, the Thermo Scientific TruNarc Handheld Narcotics Analyzer may only test positive for the cutting agent and not the illegal narcotic. I tested item LW20 a total of 3 times after believing the Thermo Scientific TruNarc Handheld Narcotics Analyzer tested positive for a known cutting agent. Also, the Thermo Scientific TruNarc Handheld Narcotics Analyzer has a difficult time testing darker items such as Heroin or Marijuana. Based on my training and experience, I believe item LW22 to be Marijuana and item LW21 to be Heroin.

### SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

On 06/25/21 at approximately 1940 hours I responded to the Corona Police Department reference an officer involved shooting. Upon arrival I met with Officer Tarrant who explained he would be assisting with charting the officer involved. Tarrant and I responded to the Corona Police Department Traffic Conference room where we met with Sergeant J. Waldon.

I took overall photos to include his duty uniform, firearm, and equipment. Officer Tarrant conducted weapon charting of Waldon's firearms and magazines (see Tarrant's report for charting details).

I then responded to 4593 Temescal Canyon Rd. (Encanto Apartments) and met with Detective J. Marquez and Detective J. Goudy who explained there were multiple small scenes that needed documentation. I was given a walk-through of each scene which first included the area where the vehicle pursuit terminated near 4661 Temescal Canyon Rd. in front of garage #1 and 2. Detective Goudy pointed out a cell phone that was lying on the ground next to the suspect vehicle (marked as item LW1) and also requested overview photographs of that area to include the suspect vehicle and law enforcement vehicles parked behind it.

Detective Goudy then directed me to the walkway east of the complex that borders the golf course and pointed out a large arrow on the sidewalk that had been painted in orange spray chalk. The arrow was on the pathway east of 4653, apartment #102. Goudy also pointed out four cartridge cases lying in the bushes just south of of the orange arrow next to the walkway and requested the collection of all four items (marked as item LW2, LW3, LW4 and LW5) Photographs of that area along with the cartridge cases were taken.

Next Goudy pointed out where Sergeant Waldon parked his police vehicle near 4597 Temescal Canyon Rd. in front of apartment #104 and requested overview photos of that area to include the interior of Waldon's vehicle.

Detective Marquez then directed me to the Eagle Glen Golf course at 1800 Eagle Glen Pkwy. Once I arrived, he transported me by golf cart to hole #12 and pointed out four items of evidence that he wanted collected near the golf cart path. The items include a knife, Santino Saputo's wallet, a blood stain and a lighter (marked as items LW6, LW7, LW8 and LW9).

Marquez also requested photographs of three golf carts (#1, #16 and #66) that were parked in the golf cart path east of hole #12.

On 06/29/21 I met with Officer Velasco and Detective Marquez at Hamner Tow. Velasco requested that I take overall photographs of a Blue Toyota Camry, plate #6TJC053. Velasco then searched the vehicle and located five items of evidence that she wanted collected. The items were transported back to the Corona Police Department and logged as follows:

On 06/30/21 per the request of Detective Marquez I responded to 4593 Temescal Canyon Rd. (Encanto Apartments). Marquez explained that he would like me to place my camera on a tripod on the orange arrow previously marked east of building 4653, in front of apartment #102 in the cemented walkway. I located the arrow he was referring to and placed my camera on a tripod on top of the arrow. Marquez placed himself on hole #12 at the Eagle Glen golf course and we communicated through our police radios. A series of photographs and video were taken by me to include photos from the orange arrow, and photos to the north and south of the arrow all facing east to the golf course. Marquez utilized Detective Mendenhall and had him run the same path several times so different perspective photographs could be taken representing the path of the suspect. Marquez then informed me over the radio that four witnesses from the night of the incident would be coming onto the course and placing themselves where they were standing that night. Once they were in place photographs were taken from the orange arrow facing east, north of the orange arrow facing east and south of the orange arrow facing east. Marquez then asked me to respond to hole #12 at the golf course and take additional perspective photographs. When I arrived the four witnesses were standing in place on the green at hole #12 and additional photographs were taken. (see Marquez' supplemental report for further details).

On 07/07/21 I met with Detective Gottfried in the Corona Police Department Forensic lab. Gottfried requested that I pull item VR01 (New English Dictionary book with locked combination safe) logged in by Corporal Ramirez of the Riverside Gang Task Force. Gottfried requested photographs of the book. I noticed a red stain on the outside of the book and conducted a presumptive test for blood utilizing a Hemastix test strip. The results were positive for the indication of blood. A swab sample was collected and logged as item LW17. I also utilized black powder and fingerprinted the outside of the book with negative results.

Gottfried then opened the front cover of the book and I utilized black powder on the inside front cover. Some ridge detail was developed, so I cut the inside of the front of the book out and placed tape over the top of it. Gottfried then pried open the metal safe to search the inside. Located inside was a blue bandana, baggies, a pipe, a scale and four baggies with what appeared to be narcotics. I utilized black powder and fingerprinted all items inside. I was able to develop ridge detail only on the glass pipe located inside. Due to not knowing the contents of the baggies, Gottfried requested assistance from Officer M. Medeiros who utilized the TruNarc system to presumptively identify the contents of the baggies. Medeiros shared the information provided and assisted in weighing the contents of the bags (see his supplemental for details) Photos of all items were taken and then the items inside the book were separated out and logged in as follows:

### SUMMARY:

Investigators from the Riverside County Gang Task Force conducted surveillance at Rockefellas Bar, 21779 Temescal Canyon Rd., Corona, for a wanted suspect at the location. During the surveillance, the suspect was seen at the location, and an attempt to stop the vehicle was made. After a short pursuit, the vehicle stopped in the Encanto Apartments, and the driver fled on foot. The driver ran towards the southeast side of the complex, over a wrought iron fence, into a small creek, and towards the Dos Lagos Golf Course. At that time, an Officer-Involved shooting occurred (See investigation for further details).

### SCENE DESCRIPTION:

This crime scene consisted of three areas, the driveway area at the southeast area of the Encanto Apartments, the area where Sergeant Waldon fired his rifle, and the green area of Hole #12 of Dos Lagos Golf Course.

Detective Goudy processed the scene in and around the Encanto Apartments, and Officer S. Velasco handled the suspect's vehicle. (See Det. Goudy and Ofcr. S. Velasco's supplemental report for details)

I handled the processing of the area where the suspect was shot and subsequently taken into custody. This area is described as the golf cart path area directly east of the green on Hole #12 and west of the bathroom building located near hole #12.

Based on witness statements, the suspect was shot and immediately dropped to the floor between golf carts #1 and #16. This was also where the suspect's personal property and the blood sample were located.

The green area for hole #12 is located in the southwest area of the Dos Lagos Golf course. This area is at the southwest perimeter of the golf course property line. The Encanto apartments are located directly west of the golf course and separated by an overgrown creek that runs north/south between the two properties. At this area of the hole (Green area), a cart path runs from north

to south along the east side of the green. The range from where Sergeant Waldon was standing and the greens, including the golf cart, was from about 150-200 yards.

During this investigation, two of the golf carts (#16 and #66) were found to be on scene at the time of the shooting, the third cart (#1) was driven to the scene by responding officers. All carts were documented and recorded at their final resting positions.

Perspective photos were taken of the scene with the witnesses standing in the positions they recalled being in when the suspects ran out of the bushes. This area was marked by police tape shortly after the officer-involved shooting.

#### DETAILS:

On June 25, 2021, I responded to assist in investigating an Officer-Involved Shooting at the Encanto Apartments (4509 Temescal Canyon Rd., Corona) and Dos Lagos Golf Course (4507 Cabot Dr., Corona). Upon arrival, I attended the incident briefing and was tasked with processing the scene along with Detective Goudy, including identifying possible evidence. The scene was split into two portions, the Encanto Apartments and the Dos Lagos Golf Course, hole #12. I processed the Dos Lagos golf course scene while Detective Goudy (See Detective Goudy's supplemental report for details) processed the Encanto Apartments scene.

I confirmed the scene was secure, and any personnel accessing or leaving the scene was being documented by Officer Sisco. Corporal Torres later took over the log until the scene was shut down at about 0515 hrs.

Shortly after the incident Officer Kouroubacalis obtained several overall scene photographs using a UAS (Drone). The photographs were uploaded to Digital OnQ. (See Officer Kouroubacalis' report)

A walkthrough was done by Sergeant Bartlett and Riverside Sheriff County Deputy Miller.

After the walkthrough was completed, I surveyed the Dos Lagos Golf Course scene and identified several items to be processed and collected by Forensic Tech Walker. I identified four items to be labeled and collected as evidence. These items included a knife, wallet, lighter, and blood sample. (See ID Tech Walkers report for complete details of items processed)

While on the scene, I reviewed a video taken from Riverside Police Helicopter, Airl, where people were located shortly after the officer-involved shooting occurred. I then advised ID Walker where the witnesses and suspect, Santino Saputo, were positioned when the video was recorded. The positions were noted, and ID Walker later took photographs from this general perspective of the area. (See ID Tech Walkers report for details)

The two scenes, including the Encanto Apartments and Dos Lagos Golf Course, were scanned using a Faro Focus 3D laser scanner to create a scene diagram. (See

Officer Roman's report for details)

The scene was shut down, and all personnel cleared the location at 0515 hrs.

The suspect's vehicle was later processed by Officer S. Velasco, during which time clothing and a receipt were located. It should be noted the receipt matched one of the credit cards in the wallet located at the golf course which also included the suspect's driver's license. (See Officer S. Velasco's supplemental report for details)

On June 30, 2021, I responded to the scene with the assistance of Detective Goudy and Detective Mendenhall. We were able to contact the four witnesses who were standing on the green of hole #12. All four witnesses responded to the green on hole #12 to assist with documenting the scene. I asked all four witnesses to stand where they were standing when the suspect ran from the bushes. All four witnesses went to different locations on the green. I noticed the positions were different from the video taken by Airl and closer to the northern portion of the green of hole #12. It should be noted these positions would have placed the witnesses closer to the suspect as he ran from the bushes.

During this time, Forensic Tech Walker took several perspective photos and videos from the Encanto Apartments scene towards the area (Green hole #12) where the suspect was shot. Using the UAS, I also took photos and videos. Detective Mendenhall assisted by running the path of the suspect as described by the witnesses. (See ID Tech Walker's supplemental report for details)

**DETAILS:**

On 06/25/2021, at about 1940 hours, I received a notification via a phone call and text message to my cellular device. The notification advised an Officer Involved Shooting had just occurred at the Dos Lagos Golf Course, located at 4507 Cabot Dr. Corona, CA. Based on the nature of the call, and as a member of the Corona Police Department's Critical Incident Response Team, I responded to the Corona Police Department, 730 Public Safety Way Corona, CA.

Upon arrival, I was teamed up with Corona Police Officer D. Alvarez. The two of us then responded to the Dos Lagos Golf Course for assignments.

Officer D. Alvarez and I were assigned to locate and review video surveillance at Rockefellas Bar located at 27100 Temescal Canyon Rd. Corona, CA. In addition, I was tasked with writing a search warrant for a black Toyota Camry (6TJC053 CA), which was part of a vehicle pursuit. The vehicle was left parked in the Encanto Apartments (4509 Temescal Canyon Road Corona, CA.), and the last known driver was identified by the initial responding officers as SU01 Santino Saputo.

Next, I responded to Rockefellas Bar and contacted the owner of the business, who identified himself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] gave Officer Alvarez and I permission to review video surveillance. Due to Officer Alvarez and I not being familiar with the video surveillance equipment, [REDACTED] (Bar Security) assisted and operated the video surveillance system. While reviewing the video surveillance I was able to identify Saputo inside Rockefellas Bar. Saputo was identified via a photo sent to my phone by Corona Police Officer Neff. Based on the video surveillance it appeared Saputo arrived in a dark colored Toyota Camry on 06/25/2021, at about 1605 hours.

Saputo parked the dark colored Toyota Camry in the north parking lot, specifically in an area designated for motorcycles (Apparent by the short diagonal painted lines). This area faces east towards a wall. Saputo and a male passenger, who was later identified as [REDACTED] exited the vehicle and entered Rockefellas Bar.

On 06/25/2021, at about 1812 hours, the video surveillance showed Saputo walked away from the bar and back to the dark colored Toyota Camry. The vehicle then drove and parked backed into the handicap stall in the same parking lot. At about 1816 hours, the vehicle exits the parking lot onto northbound Temescal Canyon Road.

[REDACTED] was unable to download a copy of the video surveillance.

Next, I responded to the Corona Police Department and wrote a search warrant for

to the dark colored Toyota Camry and requested a DNA swab from Saputo. The purpose of this request is to confirm Saputo was in fact inside the vehicle.

The warrant was reviewed and signed by the Honorable Judge Johnnetta E. Anderson, on 06/26/2021, at 0349 hours.

On 06/29/2021, at about 0900 hours, I responded to Hamner Tow (2125 Railroad St. Corona, CA.) to conduct an interior/ exterior search of the listed Toyota Camry. Detective J. Marquez and Forensic Technician L. Walker were present during this search. Two cell phones on the driver's floorboard and driver's seat. Both phones were later collected by Forensic Technician Walker. One buccal swab was obtained from the driver's steering wheel. These items were logged into evidence by Forensic Technician L. Walker, and this concluded the search of the above listed vehicle. I located a receipt in the backseat of the vehicle which contained credit card information. The Credit card information was later compared to the credit cards found in the suspect's wallet.

I then learned a copy of the video surveillance from Rockefeller Bar still needed to be obtained. Therefore, on 06/26/2021, at about 1100 hours, Detective Goudy and I responded to Rockefeller Bar. Upon arrival, we met with [REDACTED], who gave us permission to review the video surveillance and make a copy onto a USB drive. The following is a break down of the video surveillance Detective Goudy and I reviewed:

Note: The above listed business' video surveillance has 8 different camera views. The following is a breakdown of the camera views:

16:06:18 Saputo enters the main door facing west towards the street  
16:21:07 Saputo leaves the bar and walks to the north parking lot  
16:21:37 Saputo enters the dark colored Toyota Camry  
16:25:00 Saputo exited the above listed vehicle  
16:25:39 Saputo re-enters the bar via the main door  
16:35:00 Saputo begins to play a game of darts inside the bar  
17:23:45 Saputo exits the bar and is out of view on the camera system  
17:34:21 Saputo is seen inside the bar again  
17:34:56 Saputo exits the front door and talks to an unidentified male. It appears Saputo gave the unidentified male an unknown/ unidentified object in a hand-to-hand type exchange.  
17:35:36 Saputo walks back into the bar via the front door  
17:35:49 Saputo walks into the hall along with the unidentified male who walks into the restroom and Saputo appears to exit via a door that leads to the patio.  
17:35:59 Saputo exits the hallway and is seen in the patio area near a pool table  
17:44:46 Saputo walks back into the bar from the patio area  
17:59:58 Saputo exits the front/ main door

18:00:00 Saputo enters the dark colored Toyota Camry and re-parks the vehicle in the same parking lot

18:08:17 Saputo exits the vehicle

18:12:21 Saputo re-enters the vehicle with a passenger

18:13:21 Saputo drives the vehicle in the parking lot and re-parks in a handicap parking stall

18:13:31 Saputo's front passenger exits the vehicle and re-enters the bar

18:14:14 Saputo's enters the front passenger's seat

18:15:07 The vehicle leaves the parking lot and drives onto northbound Temescal Canyon Rd.

This concluded my review of the video surveillance. Detective J. Goudy retained the copy of the USB drive with the video surveillance and logged it into evidence at the Corona Police Station.

Additionally, I wrote another search warrant for all three cellular phones located in this incident. I requested a search of the cellular devices to view any pertinent evidence related to the open cases and assist in identifying co-conspirators, view evidence of communication, evidence of location, evidence of association, and evidence related to this case.

On 06/30/2021, at about 1830 hours, the Honorable Judge James Latting signed and approved the search warrant for the cellular devices.

In conclusion, I contacted Investigator Moody from the Riverside County Sheriff's

Department. Investigator Moody was advised the Corona Police Department has three cellular devices that needs to be searched for the above mentioned items. Investigator Moody advised a request via the Riverside County Sheriff's Department CATCH Team was created, and a department designee will pick up the cellular devices at a future date and time.

DETAILS: On 06-25-21, at around 1930 hours, I was contacted by Corona Police Sergeant Vega and asked to respond to Dos Lagos Golf Course, located at 4507 Cabot Rd. in Corona. Sergeant Vega told me this was regarding an Officer Involved Shooting that just occurred there, and that a Corona Police Personnel were involved. After I responded to Dos Lagos Golf Course, I was assigned to interview two of the witnesses that happened to be golfing when this occurred.

At around 2310 hours, I spoke with ██████████ in the golf course pro-shop. ██████████ said he and his friends, ██████████, ██████████ and ██████████, began golfing at Dos Lagos at around 1630 hours. ██████████ said they were putting on the 12th green when he saw "the gang unit" looking for someone in a ravine between the Encanto Apartment and the golf hole they were golfing on. ██████████ said he only saw one of the gang unit officers and this officer had asked if they had seen someone run through the ravine. ██████████ said at this point they had not seen anyone, so they told them they had not.

██████████ said they continued to play the hole (put on the green). Just after they finished playing the hole, they saw a Hispanic or Middle Eastern male run onto the golf course from the ravine. ██████████ said ██████████ yelled to the officer(s), "He's over here." ██████████ said he was still on the green at this point.

██████████ said he thought this male, later confirmed to be Santino Saputo, was running towards one of their (██████████ and his friend's) golf carts. ██████████ said he didn't know what to do so they just continued to watch until they heard gunshots. ██████████ said he heard three to four gunshots and he and his friends "hit the ground." ██████████ said he then saw Saputo, who was running, get shot and "go down."

██████████ said that after Saputo went down, he was holding his leg, pointing to his leg, and waving his arms. ██████████ said a helicopter came over head and told Saputo to stay down. ██████████ said he and his friends were not sure whether they were speaking to them too, so they continued to stay down on the ground.

██████████ said that approximately five minutes later, a gang officer came out to them and checked on their welfare. ██████████ said he believes this officer's last name was Miller. ██████████ said they continued to stay where they were at until after a police unit came and transported Saputo from the golf course.

I asked ██████████ what he saw first. ██████████ said he saw the gang unit walking around on the other side of the ravine. ██████████ said he only saw one of these officers, but his friends saw more officers. ██████████ said the next thing he saw was Saputo running. ██████████ said he was wearing a black tank-top, black pants, black shoes, and a gold chain. I asked ██████████ if he heard the officers say anything to Saputo. ██████████ said he didn't.

██████████ said Saputo looked to be headed to one of their golf carts. ██████████ said Saputo was shot prior to getting to this cart and went down right behind it.

I asked ██████████ if Saputo said anything. ██████████ said he did not hear him say anything. I asked ██████████ if he saw the suspect turn around or do any other motions. ██████████ said that when ██████████ yelled to alert the officers, Saputo looked towards them but continued to run. Other than this, ██████████ said he did not see him do anything else.

I asked [REDACTED] if he saw any other officers besides "Miller." [REDACTED] said he did not. [REDACTED] said he did not see who fired the shots or where they were fired from.

After speaking with [REDACTED] I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] confirmed he, [REDACTED] and their two other friends ([REDACTED] and [REDACTED]) began golfing at Dos Lagos Golf Course at around 1630 hours. [REDACTED] said they were on hole number twelve when then saw Police in the brush to the right of the twelfth green. [REDACTED] said the officers asked them if they had seen anyone running through there. [REDACTED] said they said they did not, because to that point, they had not seen anyone else in the brush (ravine). [REDACTED] said they just continued to play golf until Saputo came running out of the bushes and started running towards one of their golf carts and they heard gunshots.

[REDACTED] said he heard three or four gunshots. [REDACTED] said Saputo was then laying down on the cart path by one of their golf carts. [REDACTED] said about five minutes later, officers went to Saputo and handcuffed him.

I asked [REDACTED] where he initially saw the officers. [REDACTED] said that when they got to the green, prior to putting, they saw officers on the other side of a creek (with bushes) near apartments (Encanto Apartments). [REDACTED] said he believes he saw five or six officers.

[REDACTED] said they continued to put, and finished they hole, when one of his friends shouted to the officers, "he's right here." [REDACTED] said he saw Saputo run across the golf course towards the parked carts. [REDACTED] said he saw Saputo run about twenty to thirty yards before he heard gunshots. [REDACTED] said that upon hearing the shots, he and his friends immediately got down on the ground. [REDACTED] said he didn't see where the gunshots came from.

I asked [REDACTED] if he heard any of the officer's yell or say anything to Saputo. [REDACTED] said he did not. I asked [REDACTED] if he saw him do anything besides run, like turn around. [REDACTED] said he was just running "back towards us and just kept going." [REDACTED] said that after Saputo got shot in the leg, he laid on the cart path and pointed to his leg like he was indicating he got shot. I asked [REDACTED] if Saputo said anything at this point. [REDACTED] said he did not.

[REDACTED] said he and his friends just continued to stay down until they were contacted by officers. I asked [REDACTED] if the officers were easily identifiable as officers. [REDACTED] confirmed that they were.

I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled what Saputo was wearing. [REDACTED] said he was wearing black "super baggy" shorts, a black tank-top and possibly a chain. I asked [REDACTED] how far Saputo was from him when he (Saputo) got shot. [REDACTED] said he was about thirty yards away.

After speaking with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Riverside County Sheriff's Department Investigator Dan Moody questioned [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] further regarding Saputo's actions prior to be shot. See Investigator Moody's report for details.

On 06-26-21 between 0800 and 1000 hours, I was tasked to assist in contacting residents at the Encanto Apartments to see if they had witnessed this incident. I specifically contacted residents at 4649 Temescal Canyon Road, apartment numbers 101, 102, and 103. (There was no answer at apartment number 104.)

At [REDACTED], I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she was home when this incident occurred. [REDACTED] said she was alerted to the incident by her sister, [REDACTED], who also lives at the listed location. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] saw a police pursuit go past

their apartment and end in the apartment complex and called [REDACTED] and her boyfriend, [REDACTED], outside to witness what was going on.

[REDACTED] said she saw one suspect being taken out of the vehicle at the end of the pursuit and saw another open door on the vehicle. [REDACTED] said from seeing this, she concluded a suspect had fled on foot.

[REDACTED] said that after seeing this, she walked towards the east side of her apartment and saw a police presence on this side. [REDACTED] said she witnessed a bald officer wearing a dark uniform fire what she believed to be three shots. [REDACTED] pointed to an orange arrow (she called an "X") on the sidewalk to indicate where she saw the officer shoot from. [REDACTED] said she did not see what he was shooting at because trees were in the way. [REDACTED] said she knew the suspect was in the direction the officer was shooting because she saw officers go that way.

I asked [REDACTED] if she heard the officer who shot say anything. [REDACTED] said she did not, but her boyfriend heard him say, "Stand by" to other officers prior to shooting.

I pointed out a camera outside [REDACTED] residence. This camera appeared to be pointed towards the front door which is on the south side of the building (4649). [REDACTED] said this is a WIFI camera that goes to her [REDACTED] phone. [REDACTED] confirmed this would not have captured the shooting however may have captured the pursuit go by.

At [REDACTED], I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she lives alone at this residence and was not home when this incident occurred.

At [REDACTED], I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she was home when the incident occurred on 06-25-21 however did not know what had occurred. [REDACTED] said she became aware of police activity near her apartment when she exited her apartment on the parking lot side to throw away trash. [REDACTED] said at this time she saw several police cars. [REDACTED] said she looked outside the front of her apartment and saw police presence there as well. [REDACTED] said she did not see any interaction between police and a potential suspect and was not aware a shooting had even occurred. [REDACTED] had not further information that appeared to be relevant to this investigation.

I asked [REDACTED] about the "Vivent" doorbell camera she has to the left of her front door. [REDACTED] said she accesses this camera from her phone. [REDACTED] checked her phone for activations between 1900 and 1930 hours on 06-25-21. I looked at the footage of the activations during this time. All I was able to see on this footage was the head of what appeared to be a male subject on the walkway in front of [REDACTED] apartment. This camera view will show activity on her front porch however a wall on her patio obstructs any view below shoulder level on the walkway, any all views of the golf course. This footage did not appear to show anything that would aid in this investigation. Even so, I asked [REDACTED] if she was able to forward any of this footage to me however she stated she did not know how to do this. I told [REDACTED] she may be contacted at a later date regarding this footage.

On 06/25/2021 I responded to an officer involved shooting (Corona Police) located at the above listed address. Upon arrival I was assigned to interview two witnesses. [REDACTED] was the second witness I interviewed (independent of the other) at the above listed location.

[REDACTED] stated they were approaching hole number twelve on the right side of the putting green. He observed some subjects who he thought had airsoft guns near the brush area below them, but realized they were law enforcement personnel after one of them asked he and his friends had seen anyone in the area. [REDACTED] said they took a break and kind of looked around the area, then finished up their game. As [REDACTED] was picking up his golf ball, he observed a subject described as a male Hispanic, tan baggie shorts wearing a chain stumble out of the bushes. The subject was later identified by police personnel as Santino Saputo. [REDACTED] said he was standing approximately 20-30 feet away from Saputo when he first came out of the brush and stated he could identify him if he was to see him again.

[REDACTED] said he began yelling to the police officers "he's over here" pointing at Saputo. He said all the police officers were frantically grouping up to come apprehend him but had an obstructed view from where they were at in the brush. As Saputo continued to run up the hill, [REDACTED] heard six-gun shots, and observed Saputo get shot in the leg and then fall to the ground. [REDACTED] said he and two of his friends immediately got onto the ground after the gun shots and he began asking them (yelling because of the noise) if they were okay. [REDACTED] stated the helicopter was directly above them as two officers approached the suspect with AR-15 rifles while they were still on the ground. [REDACTED] observed a deputy detain Saputo near his golf cart which he suspected Saputo was initially going to try and steal to flee the scene with.

Investigator D Moody from the Riverside County Sheriff's Department conducted a follow up investigation. Inv. Moody had contacted me toward the end of my interview and had additional questions for [REDACTED] I was present and recorded the interview. For details see Investigator Moody's report or refer to my body worn camera footage.

I asked [REDACTED] a follow up question before Inv. Moody concluded his interview. I asked [REDACTED] where he was standing in proximately to his golf cart when the shooting took place. He stated his golf cart was to his right and Saputo ran around him on his left side as he ran toward his golf cart.

The following is a synopsis of my interview with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated he and his friends arrived at the Dos Lagos Golf Course around 1620 hours and played the "first 9" and then the "back 9". They heard police sirens before they arrived at hole # 12. [REDACTED] thought it was a police chase of some sort. He observed seven to eight police officers looking through the brush near them. It appeared officers were looking for someone and he watched them for six to seven minutes.

He and his friends were drifting-apart as they played, and he walked to the left of them and began watching the officers in the area. [REDACTED] was sitting on top of the bunker when he noticed what he thought was suspect in the brush.

[REDACTED] stated about 30 seconds later the suspect ran out of the brush. His friend, [REDACTED] yelled "Hey he's over here" and thought the officers had noticed him yell. [REDACTED] was attempting to flag down the police as he pointed toward the suspect. [REDACTED] continued to shout at the police, "He's over here". [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] to "Shut up" because he was afraid the suspect could have been armed.

[REDACTED] told me the suspect glanced over at him and his friends and just kept running away from the police. [REDACTED] said he was scared and walked toward the reeds and brush (away from the suspect) because he didn't know what was going on. He then turned his back away from the suspect focusing on the police searching the area. [REDACTED] then heard two-gun shots and immediately ducked, ran and "dolphin dived" below the bunker and stayed in a prone position. [REDACTED] stated a police helicopter pilot made an announcement over their loudspeaker for all golfers to stay down. [REDACTED] told me he did not hear any more gun shots after the announcements.

[REDACTED] stated he didn't remember hearing anymore gunshots after the announcements and said, "My adrenaline was pumping, I didn't hear any more shots". [REDACTED] told me he thought the suspect was shooting at the police, so he immediately took cover. [REDACTED] said he was down, lying on the ground for a while waiting until he saw a police officer (Officer "Darin").

[REDACTED] signaled for the officer because he didn't hear anymore gunshots and thought the incident was over. The officer ran over to him and initially thought [REDACTED] had been shot. [REDACTED] stated the officer realized he was not shot and asked if they ([REDACTED] and [REDACTED]) were okay and had them stand up and walk up the hill. As they walked up the hill the officer saw the suspect lying down and immediately approached him and placed him handcuffs.

I asked [REDACTED] to tell me when and where he first saw the suspect. [REDACTED] said he

first saw suspect in brush 20 yards to northeast of his location. [REDACTED] said he saw a glimpse of the suspect slowly hunched down walking through the brush and could hear his movements. [REDACTED] didn't have a clear view of the suspect while he was in the brush but then about 30 seconds later saw him clearly when he "popped out" of the brush and began running onto the course.

[REDACTED] observed the suspect from about 30-40 yards just to his right when he came out of the brush. The suspect glanced at him and his friends; but was not focused on them. The suspect ran past them through the fairway, onto the green and straight towards their golf carts. [REDACTED] thought the suspect was going to try and take one of the carts parked just above them at hole # 12 to escape from the police.

I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered when he first heard the gun shots. [REDACTED] told me heard two gun shots as the suspect was running toward their carts. [REDACTED] told me he was scared and immediately took cover. [REDACTED] originally he thought the suspect had pulled out a handgun and shot at the cops. I asked [REDACTED] if he could describe the suspect. [REDACTED] told me the suspect was 5'10 to 5'11, thin build wearing a black tank top, gold chain, shorts and white socks. [REDACTED] told me the suspect had short, shaved and curly hair with a beard. [REDACTED] stated he probably could not identify him if he saw him again.

I asked [REDACTED] if he heard the police give any commands to the suspect. [REDACTED] told me the helicopter was flying low to the ground and he couldn't hear anything because of the noise. [REDACTED] told me when he yelled towards his friends who were about 15 yards away, they were not able to hear him.

I asked [REDACTED] if he saw an officer fire a weapon and he stated he did not. [REDACTED] told me he believed he was facing the direction where the gun shots came from but did not see an officer fire. [REDACTED] did not see suspect get shot because he was facing the opposite direction when the shooting took place. [REDACTED] told me the shots sounded like AR shots and passed him by about 10 yards to his right.

This concluded my interview with [REDACTED] Investigator Moody from the Riverside Sherriff's Department was present and asked a series of follow up questions. The interview was recorded on my body worn camera. For details see Investigator Moody's report or refer to the BWC interview.

Details:

On 062921, I responded to the Corona Police Department regarding an Officer Involved Shooting that had occurred. I was briefed of the incident and assisted Riverside County Sheriff's Department CHU/FID Investigator, D. Moody. I saw that the solo involved officer, Sergeant J. Waldon was being photographed by Forensic Technician L. Walker. Refer to her report for details. Officer Tarrant was present and charting Sergeant Waldon's weapon. Refer to his report for details. I spoke with Sergeant Waldon's association attorney representative, Christopher Kucharski (with Rains Lucia Stern). Kucharski told me that Sergeant Waldon would be providing a statement on a later date (which was later determined to occur on 070621).

I responded to the Dos Lagos Golf Course and was briefed at the scene. Detective Marquez was lead for the scene and showed me where each scene and item of evidence was located. I was told that there were four golfers that were present during the OIS and that they may have witnessed the incident. Detective Mendenhall and Detective Deruyter obtained their statements along with Investigator Moody. Detective Mendenhall's interviews were captured on body worn camera. Refer to his report for details. Transcripts of Detective Deruyter's interviews were completed and attached to this report for reference. Refer to Detective Deruyter's report for details on their statements. Investigator Moody was present during those interviews and conducted follow up questions. Refer to his report for their follow up statements.

I was informed that Officer Harryman may have been present with Sergeant Waldon during the OIS. Officer Harryman responded to the Dos Lagos Golf Course and was photographed by Forensic Technician P. Delahoya. Officer Harryman stated that he preferred to provide a statement at a later time and wanted Kucharski to represent him during his interview. At the time it was unknown what his involvement was. It was later determined that Officer Harryman was only present during a portion of the OIS and was a minimal witness. Refer to Investigator Moody's report for his statement.

On 063021, I responded back to the Encanto Apartments to canvass for witnesses at the apartment complex. Along with me was Investigator Moody, Detective Mendenhall and Detective Deruyter. Refer to their reports for statements. After canvassing, I responded to the Corona Police Department to view body worn camera footage from involved personnel. Lieutenant C. Fountain told me there there was an issue with Sergeant Waldon's dash camera and recordings. I also discovered that for an unknown reason, Sergeant Waldon's body worn camera did not have audio. Note: Sergeant Waldon's dash camera was activated and recording once the emergency lights were activated. When the dash camera is activated, the body worn camera usually activates. Due to the dash camera not functioning properly, the unit was written up and taken out of service by Lt. Fountain.

I watched Sergeant Waldon's body worn camera and confirmed there was no audio. The suspect is not seen in the video and the view is obscured by Sergeant Waldon's hand and rifle. As I continued to watch the footage, I saw a uniformed gang task force agent walking up toward Sergeant Waldon as the OIS was occurring. I later discovered that was CHP Officer Rivero. Refer to Investigator Moody's report for details on Rivero's statement. I provided a copy of Sergeant Waldon's OIS video to Investigator Moody, refer to his report for details.

I saw Riverside Police Department, air support (Air-1) was on scene at the time of the incident. I discovered they had video while they were on scene. Officer Hungerford obtained a copy of the video and provided it to me. I logged in a copy of the video into evidence at the Corona Police Department's digital evidence system. I watched the video and saw that the OIS was not captured on video and that I could see the suspect was lying on the ground and there were four golfers lying on the green near the suspect. I provided a copy of that video to Investigator Moody, refer to his report for details. Investigator Moody and

Detective M. Placencia responded to the Riverside Police Department hanger at a later date and obtained a statement from Pilot, J. Post and Observer, Officer Moulton. Refer to Investigator Moody's report for details.

I watched K9 Officer M. Neff's dash and body worn camera footage. I saw Officer Neff drive behind the suspect vehicle and activate his lights in attempt to conduct a traffic stop. I watched as the suspect evaded Officer Neff and a pursuit ensued. Refer to Officer Neff's report for details. I provided a copy of those videos to Investigator Moody. Detective R. Gonzalez provided me with a copy of the primary radio traffic during the incident. I listened to the recording and provided a copy of that radio traffic to Investigator Moody, refer to his report for details.

On 063021, I responded to the Corona Police Department to assist with Officer Harryman's interview. The interview took place on the second floor of the Corona Police Department Chief Conference room. Present during the interview was the following: Officer Harryman, LRS Attorney Kucharski, DDA Nikolaus Peterson, RSO FID Investigator Moody and myself. The interview was audio recorded only. Refer to Investigator Moody's report for Officer Harryman's statement. It was confirmed during the interview that Officer Harryman did not witness the OIS incident.

On 070621, I responded to the Corona Police Department to assist with Sergeant Waldon's interview. The interview took place on the second floor of the Corona Police Department Chief Conference room. Present during the interview was the following: Sergeant Waldon, LRS Attorney Kucharski, DDA Nikolaus Peterson, RSO FID Investigator Moody and myself. The interview was audio recorded only. On 06/25/2021 at approximately 2145 hours, Sr. Det. Gottfried and I interviewed Thomas Cervantes at the Corona Police Jail.

Cervantes was the passenger in the vehicle driven by Santino Saputo and he was detained and transported to the Corona Police Department Jail at the conclusion of the pursuit.

I told Cervantes he was detained and at that point he was not charged with any crime and he said he was ok with it. I told him I would like to ask him some questions reference the incident he was involved in earlier that evening, but prior to interviewing him I would read him his rights.

I then read him his rights per Miranda and he said he understood his rights. He then agreed to answer any questions I had.

Cervantes told me earlier that afternoon he went his work which is in the El Cerrito area in order to speak to his boss and pick up his check. Cervantes said that after meeting with his boss, he went to Rockafellas Bar, where he met Santino Saputo.

Cervantes said he has known Saputo for about a year and said that Saputo just happened to be at the same bar when he went there. Cervantes told me he that prior to today, he saw Saputo two days prior.

Cervantes told me he then asked Saputo to give him a ride home and Saputo agreed. The two of them then left the bar and entered a Toyota Camry which was parked in the parking lot of the bar. Cervantes said Saputo was driving and he sat in the front passenger seat. Cervantes stated he believed the vehicle belonged to Saputo because Saputo had the keys and he had seen Saputo driving the same vehicle in the past.

I asked Cervantes what happened next and he told me he passed out once he entered the vehicle. I asked him what he meant by "passed out" and he said he fell asleep.

Cervantes told me the next thing he remembered was being awoken by the police, at which point he complied with their requests and he was detained.

Cervantes claimed he was asleep the entire time and does not know what took place from the time he left the bar to the point he was detained by the police. Cervantes said he did not see any lights or hear any sirens at any point.

Cervantes said when he was awoken by the police, Saputo was not in the car and he did not see where he went.

During the interview, Cervantes said that he and Saputo were arrested together for possession of a firearm and he said he is currently out on bail for that arrest.

I asked Cervantes if he and Santino communicated in any way earlier that day and he said he did not. He said he last communicated with Saputo two days before.

It was obvious to me that Cervantes was not being truthful and forthcoming with information reference what took place earlier that evening. I asked Cervantes if he really did not know what took place, or he just did not want to tell me.

Cervantes said he told me what he had to say and he was sticking to that story.

Once it was determined that Cervantes' involvement was nothing more than being a passenger in the vehicle, he was then released without any charges.

Attached to the back of the carrier is the word POLICE in large visible letters. I was driving a marked black and white patrol vehicle (CPD Unit# 79291).

At about 1911, Officer Neff was involved in a vehicle pursuit which terminated in the Encanto Apartment Complex. The driver / suspect (Santino Saputo) ultimately fled on foot and ran onto the Dos Lagos Golf Course. While Saputo fled from officers, an officer involved shooting occurred. I responded to the location from the Corona Police Department. I drove directly to the golf course where involved officers were having trouble contacting Saputo due to his location on the golf course. I drove my patrol unit onto the golf course and met up with several officers who were contacting Saputo.

Due to our location (far from the entrance / exit), the decision was made to load Saputo into the back seat of my patrol vehicle with Officer Newell. I then transported Saputo to the front of Dos Lagos Golf Course where an American Medical Response unit was staged. Saputo was then transported to the hospital. Officers accompanied Saputo inside of the AMR unit as I followed in my patrol vehicle. After arriving at Riverside Community Hospital and ensuring I was no longer needed, I responded back to the scene.

Once back at the scene, I transitioned into assisting with the officer involved shooting investigation. I was briefed on the incident and assisted Riverside County Sheriff's Department CHU/FID Investigator, D. Moody. In addition to walking the scene and canvassing for any potential witnesses, I was present and assisted during the following interviews which were conducted at later dates:

- Airl pilot Officer J. Post-present at OIS
- Airl observer Officer Moulton- present at OIS
- CHP Officer Rivero-present near Sergeant Waldon at time of OIS
