**Re: Non-Fatal Officer Involved Shooting on February 3, 2016, by Corona
Police Corporal Ryan Kuzsak, Badge No. 11099; Corona Case No. CR 16-1380**

Dear Chief Abel:

We have reviewed the investigative reports and other materials submitted by the Corona Police Department concerning the non-fatal and non-injury officer-involved shooting by Corporal Ryan Kuzsak that took place on February 3, 2016. Our office completed its review of this incident on December 20, 2016.

PERSONS INVOLVED

At the time of the incident, Keith Winn was 38 years old. Winn's wife, [REDACTED] was present during the incident. They have two children in common, [REDACTED] (15 years old) and [REDACTED] (12 years old).

On the date of this incident, February 3, 2016, Corona Corporal Ryan Kuzsak had been a sworn peace officer for approximately 18 years. Corporal Kuzsak was working patrol in the city of Corona and was in full uniform. Corona Officer Gutierrez was working patrol in the city of Corona and was in full uniform. Finally, Corona Officer Renstrom was working patrol with his Department K9 in the city of Corona and was in full uniform.

FACTUAL SUMMARY OF THE INCIDENT

On Tuesday, February 3, 2016, at approximately 12:45 a.m., the Corona Police Department received a call regarding a domestic violence incident at a residence located at 1729 Greenview, Corona. The reporting party [REDACTED] was the 15-year-old daughter of subject Keith Winn and victim [REDACTED]

During the 911 call, ██████ stated that she was locked in her bedroom along with her 12- and 8-year-old siblings. ██████ had just witnessed her father (Winn) and mother ██████ arguing and yelling at each other. She stated that the yelling had escalated to the point that Winn was sitting on top of ██████ and not allowing her to get up. While on the phone with 911, ██████ stated that she could hear her parents yelling in the garage, and abruptly ended the 911 call stating that she “needed to go.”

Corporal Ryan Kazsuk was first on scene at 12:49 a.m. Officers Steven Renstrom and Carlos Gutierrez arrived almost immediately after Corporal Kazsuk.

As Corporal Kazsuk approached the home, he peered through the garage window and witnessed a verbal argument between Winn and ██████ inside a “mud room” hallway leading into the garage. Thereafter, Corporal Kazsuk observed Winn arm himself with a handgun that Winn retrieved from a cabinet. Winn appeared to chamber a bullet and walk back into the house with two guns in his left hand. Winn was moving as if he was “walking with a purpose.” Corporal Kazsuk yelled at Winn to drop the guns numerous times, but Winn did not comply.

Corporal Kazsuk fired his duty weapon at Winn, but none of the shots struck Winn. Although uninjured, Winn fell to the ground and Officers found Winn lying in the doorway between the garage and an interior room of the home. Two loaded handguns were found on the floor immediately next to Winn. No rounds were chambered in the weapons located next to Winn.

THE INVESTIGATION

Interview with Corporal Kazsuk

Corporal Kazsuk provided a voluntary statement and explained that as he approached the home he could hear arguing in the garage so he looked through the window of the garage door. Corporal Kazsuk witnessed Winn and ██████ arguing in the “mud room” hallway that leads into the garage. After they continued arguing for a few seconds, Corporal Kazsuk saw Winn walk toward a cabinet and obtain a handgun. Corporal Kazsuk believed Winn appeared to chamber a bullet. Corporal Kazsuk observed Winn walk back into the house with two guns in his left hand. Winn was moving as if he was “walking with a purpose.” Corporal Kazsuk yelled at Winn to drop the guns numerous times, and then Corporal Kazsuk fired his duty weapon at Winn. Corporal Kazsuk repeatedly stated that he fired his duty weapon out of concern for the people’s safety in the home.

Corporal Kazsuk’s Audio Recording

Corporal Kazsuk’s audio recorder was recovered after the shooting. In the beginning of the recording, a man and woman can be heard arguing in the distance. This is followed by Corporal Kazsuk telling other officers that the suspect is armed with a handgun. Corporal Kazsuk can be heard yelling “Hey stop right there” and then repeatedly yell for the suspect to “stop.” This yelling is followed by six consecutive gunshots.

Interview with Officer Carlos Gutierrez

Officer Gutierrez wrote a report summarizing his observations and actions on February 3, 2016. At approximately 12:44 a.m. on that date, he heard Corona Police Dispatch broadcast that a reporting party was calling about her mother and father fighting. Dispatch advised that the father had pinned the mother down and both were currently in the garage. The reporting party advised Dispatch that she could hear her mother crying.

While enroute to the address, Officer Gutierrez heard Corporal Kazsuk broadcast that he was on scene and waiting for additional units to arrive before making contact with the occupants of the residence. At approximately 12:55 a.m., Officer Gutierrez arrived on scene with Officer Renstrom. As he approached the driveway, Officer Gutierrez could see Corporal Kazsuk looking into the garage through one of the south windows. Officer Gutierrez could hear a loud “angry” male voice yelling from inside the garage. Corporal Kazsuk told Officer Gutierrez that the man was armed with two guns and that he was going inside the house. Officer Gutierrez heard Corporal Kazsuk yell “Stop” several times. Simultaneously, Corporal Kazsuk told Officer Gutierrez to make entry into the home. As Officer Gutierrez walked towards the front door, he looked through a garage window and saw Winn walking towards the interior door holding a black handgun in his right hand. Officer Gutierrez described Winn’s face as having an “angry expression.” Gutierrez wrote in his report:

Due to his angry expression and the circumstances of the call I believed he had assaulted his wife and was going inside the house to shoot her. I also believed he was aware that the police had been called and was coming outside to shoot us. I believed this because when CPL Kazsuk yelled for him to stop he did not bother to turn towards us to see who was yelling outside of his home.

Officer Gutierrez ran towards the front door in order to make entry into the house. Once Officer Gutierrez reached the front door, he heard four to five gunshots which he believed had been fired by Corporal Kazsuk. Officer Gutierrez attempted to kick the front door in but was initially unsuccessful. Within seconds, Corporal Kazsuk ran up to the front door and assisted in kicking the front door in. Winn was apprehended just inside the doorway lying face down on the floor. A black handgun was laying approximately 1 foot away from Winn’s right hand. A second handgun was located approximately three feet away from Winn’s right hand.

Winn was placed under arrest and carried outside. He yelled and cursed at the officers.

Officer Renstrom’s Police Report

Officer Renstrom authored a police report dated February 4, 2016. In his report, he indicates that he was dispatched to 1729 Greenview Ave at about 0044 hours. Officer Renstrom wrote that when he began walking up the driveway of the residence he heard Corporal Kazsuk say, “He’s armed with a handgun in the garage.” Quickly thereafter, he heard Corporal Kazsuk yell at the male in the garage, “Hey, stop right there.” Next Officer Renstrom heard Corporal Kazsuk say, “Get ready to make entry, get ready to react. He’s got two handguns and he’s going into the house.”

At that point, Officer Renstrom began running towards the front door of the residence. Officer Renstrom heard Corporal Kazsuk give the male a couple more commands to stop and then he heard Corporal Kazsuk shoot several rounds into the garage. Corporal Kazsuk then yelled, "He's got a gun, he went back inside, get in now breach." Officer Renstrom saw Officer Guitierrez and Corporal Kazsuk breach the front door and contact Winn who was lying on the ground in front of the garage inside door. Officer Renstrom did a sweep of the residence and located the additional family members.

Other Evidence Recovered

No civilians or officers were injured as a result of this shooting.

A total of five bullet strikes were located in the drywall and door frame in the garage. A sixth bullet entered a wall inside the house as the door was being opened by Winn.

Six bullet casings were located outside of the garage in the vicinity of where Corporal Kazsuk discharged his firearm.

A BMW with a shattered windshield was parked in the driveway of the residence. Two glass mason jars were located on the street.

Corporal Kazsuk's duty weapon was examined. The magazine contained 11 rounds of department-issued ammunition, with a capacity for 17 rounds. Another round was in the chamber.

Toxicology Results for Keith Winn

Bio-Tox Laboratories analyzed blood drawn from Keith Winn at 3:45 a.m. At that time, Winn's BAC was .07. Cannabinoids were also present in Winn's blood.

Interview with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was interviewed at the scene by Detective Gottfried. During the interview, [REDACTED] became defensive and indicated that she did not want to press any charges. She and Winn had been in a long relationship and had recently broken up and gotten back together. The previous evening, February 2, she learned Winn was not at the house watching the kids as he had represented. [REDACTED] attempted to call Winn numerous times, however he did not respond. Due to Winn not responding to her calls, [REDACTED] was forced to rush home. Approximately an hour after [REDACTED] arrived home, Winn arrived at the house.

The two immediately began to argue and yell at each other. Winn was using vulgarities and called [REDACTED] a "bitch." While arguing, Winn repeatedly stated that he was going to leave. [REDACTED] attempted to block the door and push him away from the exit of the master bedroom. At one point, Winn pushed [REDACTED] out of the way to get out of the room. [REDACTED] fell backwards and Winn straddled her in order to prevent her from continuously hitting him. [REDACTED] was able to get up and obtain numerous mason jars, and she then went outside and threw them against Winn's BMW windshield in an attempt to keep him from leaving the house.

Winn was furious at [REDACTED] actions, but he continued to encourage [REDACTED] to go back inside of the house. Winn was concerned about making a scene in front of the neighbors. Once they both went inside, Winn became enraged, punched a wall, and yelled "Fuck this shit, fuck this shit." Winn began cussing about [REDACTED] as well as about the kids. [REDACTED] went upstairs due to being concerned for herself and her children's safety. Within minutes of going upstairs, [REDACTED] heard gunshots being fired into the garage.

Interview with [REDACTED]

After a protective sweep of the house, Officer Avila made contact with [REDACTED] the 15-year-old reporting party, and daughter of [REDACTED] and Keith Winn. [REDACTED] stated that earlier in the night, she was in her room when she heard her mom and dad arguing in their bedroom. In addition to the arguing, she heard a "thump" come from the bedroom. [REDACTED] and her sister ran to their mother's bedroom and opening the door [REDACTED] saw her mother [REDACTED] laying on her back on the floor near the bed. [REDACTED] was being held down by her father Keith Winn, who was kneeling next to their mother with his hands on her shoulders, pinning her down. As he did this, their mother was yelling for him to get off of her. [REDACTED] told her father to let her mother go, however, he told her to "shut up" and go to her room. [REDACTED] went back to her room and called her grandmother for help. After the hearing the argument get louder, she called 911.

Interview with Keith Winn

Winn was interviewed at the Corona Police Station by Detective Vorhees on February 3, 2016. During the previous night, Winn went to a bar in Upland and drank one beer. While at the bar, Winn received a call from [REDACTED] and could tell by her voice that she was extremely upset, so he left the bar to go home. Winn also smoked a small amount of marijuana earlier in the day.

When Winn arrived home, [REDACTED] began to yell at the top of her lungs about different issues. [REDACTED] accused Winn of having an affair and repeatedly yelled at him for not having a job. Due to [REDACTED] behavior, Winn attempted to gather some personal belongings, including both of his guns.

While arguing in the master bedroom, Winn grabbed the first gun and held it in his hand. Winn attempted to leave the bedroom, but [REDACTED] blocked his path as Winn approached the door. [REDACTED] grabbed Winn and caused him to turn with her, resulting in the both of them falling to the floor. [REDACTED] fell on her back and Winn fell to his knees. Winn did not recall where the gun was at this time. While Winn was on the ground, his 15-year-old daughter came into the room and Winn yelled at her to leave. Shortly thereafter, Winn was able to leave the bedroom and he began to leave the house through the garage. Before Winn was able to get into his vehicle, [REDACTED] grabbed two glass jars and threw them at his vehicle. One jar caused his windshield to shatter, and the other caused a dent to the side of his vehicle.

Due to the volume of their argument, Winn decided not to leave and instead return into the house to avoid neighbors seeing and hearing them. Winn attempted to calm [REDACTED] however she walked away and went in the house.

Winn retrieved a second gun that was in the garage and was going to walk into the house and allow the situation to calm down. Winn denied chambering any bullets, but admitted he may have inserted a magazine in one of the guns due to the magazine not being all the way inserted. While walking back into the house, Winn heard bullets “whizzing by my head” and fell to the ground in shock.

APPLICABLE LEGAL STANDARDS

Under California law, a peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that a person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use reasonable force to make the arrest, prevent escape, and overcome resistance. (Pen. Code, § 835a.) The officer need not retreat or end his efforts to make the arrest because of the person’s resistance. (Pen. Code, § 835a.) Penal Code section 834a requires that if a person has either actual or constructive knowledge that he is being arrested by a peace officer, the person must refrain from using force or any weapon to resist such arrest. In addition, peace officers, in the course of their duties, may use deadly force to protect themselves or others from the threat of death or great bodily harm. As stated in CALCRIM 2670 [Lawful Performance: Peace Officer], “Special rules control the use of force. A peace officer may use reasonable force to arrest or detain someone, to prevent escape, to overcome resistance, or in self-defense.”

Peace officers, in the course of their duties, may use deadly force to protect themselves or others from the threat of death or great bodily harm. In addition to the laws specifically applicable to the use of deadly force by peace officers in the performance of their duties, the laws of self-defense and defense of another are available to any person, including peace officers. A person acts in lawful self-defense/defense of another if: (1) the person reasonably believed that he or someone else was in imminent danger of being killed or suffering great bodily injury; (2) the person reasonably believed that the immediate use of deadly force was necessary to defend against the danger; and (3) the person used no more force than was reasonably necessary to defend against that danger. (See CALCRIM 3470.)

In deciding whether a person’s beliefs were reasonable, all the circumstances as they were known to and appeared to that person should be considered as well as what a reasonable person in a similar situation with similar knowledge would have believed. If the person’s beliefs were reasonable, the danger does not need to have actually existed. (CALCRIM 505.) Additionally, the person is not required to retreat. He is entitled to stand his ground and defend himself and, if reasonably necessary, to pursue an assailant until the danger of death/great bodily injury has passed. This is so even if safety could have been achieved by retreating. (CALCRIM 505.)

The United States Supreme Court held in *Graham v. Connor* (1989) 490 U.S. 386 that an officer’s use of force is to be analyzed under the Fourth Amendment’s objective reasonableness standard, and “[t]he calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments – in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving – about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation.” (*Graham v. Connor, supra*, 490 U.S. at pp. 396-397.) Further, the High Court directed, “[t]he reasonableness of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight,” and the totality of the circumstances must be taken into account. (*Id.* at p. 396.) “[I]ts proper application

requires careful attention to the facts and circumstances of each particular case, including the severity of the crime at issue, whether the suspect poses an immediate threat to the safety of the officers or others, and whether he is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight.” (*Ibid.*)

CONCLUSION

At the time of the shooting, Corporal Kazsuk was a peace officer lawfully engaged in the performance of his duties. While on patrol, Corporal Kazsuk was dispatched to a call involving domestic violence at 1729 Greenview, Corona. While approaching the garage he could hear a heated conversation between a man and a woman inside the residence. Corporal Kazsuk approached the garage and was able to see inside through a window. He witnessed Winn retrieve a handgun, and both Corporal Kazsuk and Officer Gutierrez described Winn’s demeanor as angry as Winn began to walk back into the residence while holding two handguns. Corporal Kazsuk ordered Winn to drop the weapons numerous times before discharging his duty weapon six times. Winn was not struck by any of the bullets.

Corporal Kazsuk had a reasonable belief that Winn was going to gravely injure someone in the residence. His belief was reasonable due to: 1) the nature of the call (domestic violence), 2) Winn’s demeanor, 3) Winn retrieving a handgun from the cabinet and walking back into the home holding two firearms, and 4) the fact that Winn refused to drop his firearms when ordered. Under the circumstances, his decision to use deadly force was reasonable and done in justifiable defense of others. Corporal Kazsuk bears no criminal liability for his actions.

[REDACTED] and Keith Winn were married for about five years and then divorced. They started dating again about two years ago and moved in together at 1729 Greenview Ave. They have two children in common [REDACTED]

Assisting Personnel:

Officer C. Gutierrez

Details:

On 02/03/16, at about 0044 hours, I responded to 1729 Greenview Ave., reference a domestic disturbance. The reporting party (15 Yrs.) told CPD dispatch that her mother and father were physical and her father had her mother pinned to the ground. Upon arrival I approached the residence from the south with Ofcr. C. Gutierrez. I noticed Cpl. Kazsuk standing in front of the closed garage door of the listed residence. When I started walking up the driveway I heard Cpl. Kazsuk say, "He's armed with a handgun in the garage." Cpl. Kazsuk was looking through the decorative windows on top of the garage door. I quickly gained cover behind the pillar located in between the garage doors (three car garage) and drew my duty weapon. I was unable to see Winn inside the garage due to my location and height of the garage windows.

I heard Cpl. Kazsuk yell, "Hey, stop right there", towards the male (SU01 Keith Winn) in the garage. Then I heard Cpl. Kazsuk say, "Get ready to make entry, get ready to react. He's got two handguns and he's going into the house." That's when I started running towards the front door of the residence. Cpl. Kazsuk gave the male a couple more commands to stop and then I heard him

1 shoot several rounds into the garage. I knew Cpl. Kazsuk was shooting because I was running past
2 him when the shots were fired. Cpl. Kazsuk then yelled, "He's got a gun, he went back inside, get
3 in now breech."

4
5 At that point C. Gutierrez was attempting to force entry into the front door by kicking it. Ofcr. C.
6 Guteirrez' first attempt failed but with the assistance of Cpl. Kazsuk, they were able to kick the door
7 open. Ofcr. C. Gutierrez, Cpl. Kazsuk and I entered the residence. Ofcr. C. Gutierrez and Cpl.
8 Kazsuk contacted Winn who was lying on the ground in front of the garage man door (inside the
9 residence). The stairs were immediately to the right when entering the front door. While Cpl.
10 Kazsuk and Ofcr. C. Gutierrez detained Winn for further investigation of the domestic dispute, I
11 searched the upstairs. I located three juveniles and one adult female (OT01 [REDACTED])
12 upstairs in the north/east bedroom.

13
14 [REDACTED] was screaming frantically asking if we killed Keith, and the juveniles were crying. After
15 confirming nobody was injured upstairs, I spoke with [REDACTED] separately. The following is a summary
16 of her statement. [REDACTED] stated when she got home from work tonight, Winn wasn't home. [REDACTED]
17 was angry because Winn was supposed to be watching the children and he left them home alone.
18 [REDACTED] called Winn on his cell phone and began arguing with him because he went out drinking
19 instead of staying home to watch the kids.

20
21 Winn came home shortly after when [REDACTED] was taking a shower. When [REDACTED] exited the shower,
22 Winn approached her and began arguing with her again. [REDACTED] said Winn was drunk but he wasn't
23 acting normal. It appeared he was on some type of drug because his mood would change back
24 and forth quickly from being nice to mean. Winn said he wanted to leave and started walking
25 towards the bedroom door (master bedroom). [REDACTED] blocked Winn by standing in front of the door.
26 Winn attempted to get by [REDACTED] by pushing her to the side but [REDACTED] pushed his hand away,
27 [REDACTED] said a small scuffle ensued which ended up with Winn holding her down on the ground.
28 [REDACTED] said Winn was holding her down to make her calm and to stop her.

29
30 That is when the children came into their bedroom and saw Winn holding [REDACTED] down. The
31 children quickly left and Winn got up. Winn walked downstairs and exited the residence. When

1 Winn got into his vehicle which was parked in the driveway, [REDACTED] grabbed a glass bottle and
2 threw it at the windshield causing the windshield to crack.

3
4 Winn exited his vehicle and they both went back into the residence. Winn was very upset and kept
5 saying things like, "Fuck the kids." Winn started yelling and punching the walls downstairs. [REDACTED]
6 said they both walked out to the garage and [REDACTED] attempted to calm Winn down but he was
7 getting more agitated. [REDACTED] was frightened because she'd never seen Winn act like this. [REDACTED]
8 ran back into the residence up to her kid's bedroom. All three children were in the north/east
9 bedroom and the door was locked. [REDACTED] said she was going to grab her kids and leave the
10 residence but couldn't get in due to the locked door. *(It should be noted [REDACTED] was only wearing a*
11 *shirt and underwear at this time)* That's when [REDACTED] heard gunshots coming from outside. When
12 [REDACTED] heard the gunshots, she thought Winn had a gun and he was going to come upstairs and
13 shoot them.

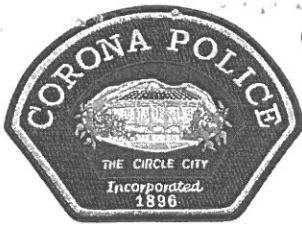

15 [REDACTED] said she and Winn have been involved in physical altercations in the past. She said Winn
16 was arrested for domestic violence about 10 years ago in Bellflower, CA. [REDACTED] said Winn never
17 tried to strike him nor did he try to strike her during this altercation. When I asked [REDACTED] if Winn
18 owned guns, she said he talked about guns and thought he had one but she didn't see it
19 tonight. [REDACTED] said the only part of this altercation the children witnessed was when they entered
20 their bedroom and saw Winn holding her down.

21
22 I then contacted VM03 [REDACTED] away from the other children and [REDACTED]. The following is
23 a summary of his statement. [REDACTED] stated he was sleeping in his bedroom (upstairs north side)
24 when he was woken up by his sisters slamming their bedroom doors. [REDACTED] said he looked at the
25 cable box in his room and saw that it was 0045 hours. [REDACTED] heard his [REDACTED] ([REDACTED] mother)
26 and Winn arguing downstairs so he exited his bedroom. [REDACTED] saw [REDACTED] open the front door
27 and say, "I'm going to call the police on you." Winn was inside the residence punching walls at this
28 time.

1 At one point [REDACTED] walked downstairs and saw [REDACTED] and Winn inside the downstairs bathroom.
2 Winn was holding [REDACTED] arm attempting to calm her down. [REDACTED] went back upstairs and joined
3 his sisters inside the north/east bedroom. It was difficult to obtain a detailed statement from [REDACTED]
4 due to his age.

5

6 After speaking with [REDACTED] the detectives arrived and took over the investigation. Refer to
7 Detective Voorhees report for disposition.

4 **DETAILS:**

5 On 2/3/16, at about 0044 hours, I responded to 1729 Greenview Ave, Corona in regards to a
6 Domestic Violence call. I heard CPD Dispatch say over the radio that the RP- [REDACTED] (15yrs)
7 was calling about her mother and father fighting. CPD Dispatch advised the father had pinned
8 the mother down and both were currently in the garage. The RP advised CPD Dispatch that she
9 could hear her mother crying. The RP soon advised she had to go and disconnected with our 911
10 call taker.

12 While enroute to the address, I heard CPL KAZSUK say he was on scene and waiting for an
13 additional police unit to arrive before making contact at the residence, due to the circumstances
14 of the call. At about 0055 hours, I arrived on scene as well as OFC RENSTROM. I walked
15 towards the residence with my K9 partner "CLAUD".

16

17 As I approached the driveway of the residence I saw CPL KAZSUK looking into the garage
18 from the small outside window. I heard a loud male voice yelling from inside the garage and it
19 sounded like he was angry. At the same time I heard CPL KAZSUK say over the radio that he
20 was hearing an argument inside the garage. At this time I was walking up the driveway of this
21 residence towards the garage door. CPL KAZSUK was standing near the south portion of the
22 garage door and I was walking towards the north portion of the garage door. Moments later I
23 heard CPL KAZSUK say the subject was armed with two guns and that he was going inside the
24 house. I heard CPL KAZSUK yell "STOP" several times. I also heard CPL KAZSUK tell me
25 that we needed to make entry into the house. At this time I was close enough to the garage door

1 CPL KAZSUK yelled for the subject to stop but I never saw the subject turn towards CPL
2 KAZSUK'S voice to see who was yelling. I noticed the subject appeared to be angry and upset
3 by his facial expression. Due to his angry expression and the circumstances of the call I believed
4 he had assaulted his wife and was going inside the house to shoot her. I also believed he was
5 aware that the police had been called and was coming outside to shoot us. I believed this
6 because when CPL KAZSUK yelled for him to stop he did not bother to turn towards us to see
7 who was yelling outside of his home.

8
9 Fearing the subject's wife and kids were in danger I turned and ran towards the front door to the
10 residence to force the door open. At the same time I turned away from CPL KAZSUK and I
11 heard about 4-5 gun shots. I knew these gun shots were coming from CPL KAZSUK. As I
12 approached the front door I began kicking the door several times to open it. I was not successful
13 in forcing entry due to having my K9 at my side and keeping me off balance. The doors were
14 French style doors with a large glass on the center of each of them where I could see into the
15 house. While kicking the doors I could see through the glass a BMA, lying face down on floor
16 midway in the entry way of the residence. Through the glass I could see the subject's head and
17 upper torso.

18
19 CPL KAZSUK came next to me and assisted me with kicking and opening the doors. As the
20 doors opened I could see the BMA, lying face down on the floor. I saw his right hand was near
21 the top of his head almost extended out. The subject's left hand was down along his side and
22 blocked by a wall.

24 After the doors opened I saw a black handgun about 1 foot away from his right hand. I ordered
25 the subject to show us his hands, due to not being able to see his left hand. I saw the subject was
26 not moving and I believed the subject was shot. CPL KAZSUK, OFC RENSTROM and I made

1 the floor also near his right hand. CPL KAZSUK ordered the subject to place both hands behind
2 his back and he did not move or comply. I looked at the subject and saw his back moving up and
3 down indicating he was alive and breathing. I also noticed the subject had no blood stains on his
4 clothing or around his person. CPL KAZSUK then placed both of the subject's hands behind his
5 back and placed handcuffs on him.

6
7 Medical aid was immediately requested for the subject. The rest of the family was upstairs
8 during the incident and began walking towards the stairs to see what had happened. I heard a
9 female voice scream. Fearing that the family would come down and attempt to lynch or
10 intervene with the detention, the subject was carried outside. The subject was also moved
11 outside by the front door to render medical aid if needed and to check for possible bullet wounds.
12 I grabbed the subjects pant legs and CPL KAZSUK grabbed his arms to pick him up. He was
13 carried towards the front door and placed down by the front door. At about this time the subject
14 began yelling and cursing at us.

15
16 Upon the arrival of CPL D. AVILA, he and I checked the downstairs residence for possible
17 shooting victims. While conducting a safety check I saw several bullet holes on the downstairs
18 bathroom door frame and wall. I noticed the bullets did not penetrate the outer wall of the
19 downstairs bathroom. We also checked the backyard and back wall of the residence for any
20 bullet holes. I did not see any bullet holes on the outside wall of the residence.

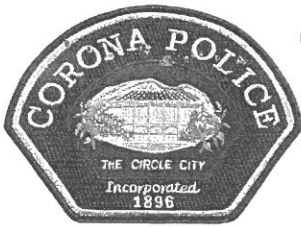

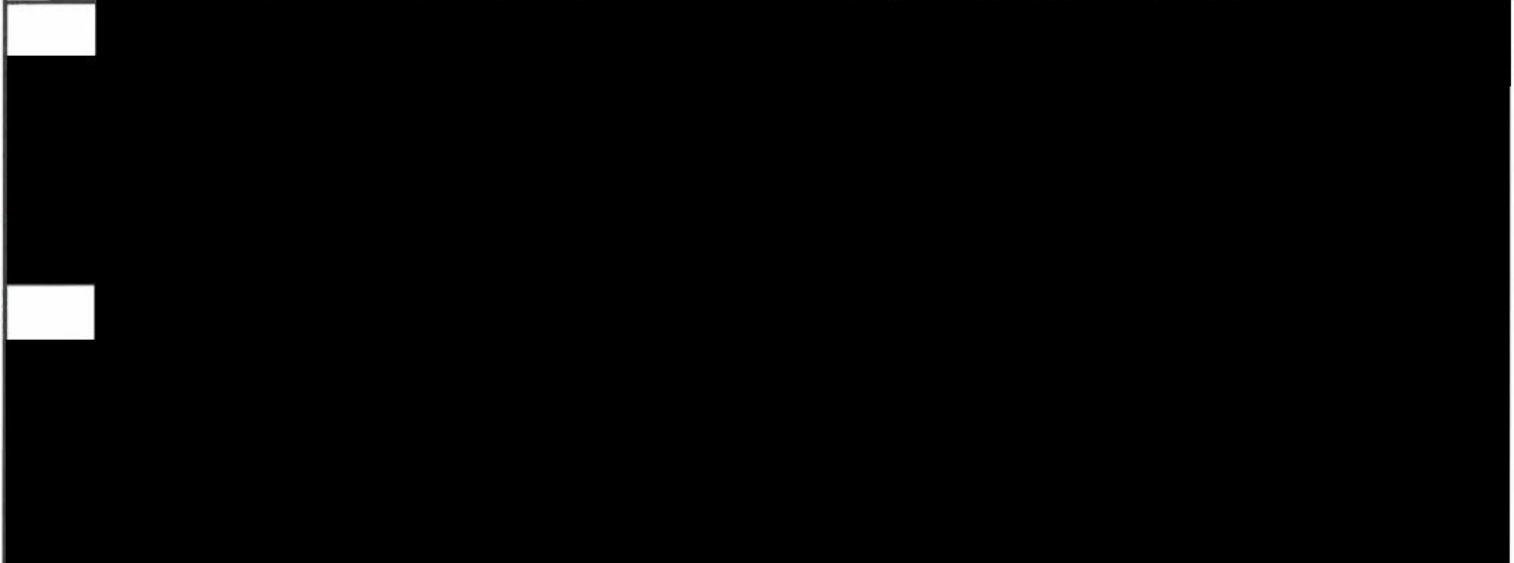

EVIDENCE:

A CD-R containing audio of my interviews with the listed parties was entered into evidence by me.

A CD-R with photos of the involved children was entered into evidence by me. The photos were taken by me at the scene.

DETAILS:

On 02-03-16 at approximately 0044 hours, I responded to 1729 Greenview Ave reference an officer involved shooting that occurred during a domestic violence investigation. Upon arrival, I assisted Officer Carlos Gutierrez in conducting a protective sweep of the downstairs and backyard of the residence. I walked upstairs and spoke with the reporting party (RP), [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of her recorded statement:

Earlier tonight, [REDACTED] was in her room when she heard her mom [REDACTED] and dad (Keith Winn) arguing in their bedroom. She explained that her mother is a nurse in Riverside and works nights and had just arrived home from work early. In addition to hearing them arguing, [REDACTED] also heard a "thump" noise come from their bedroom. She and her sister [REDACTED] ran to their mother's bedroom and opened the door. [REDACTED] saw her mother laying on her back on the floor near her bed. She was being held down by their father, who was kneeling next to their mother with his hands on her shoulders, pinning her down. As he did this, their mother was yelling for him to get off of her. [REDACTED] told their father to let their mother go, however he told them to "shut up" and go to their room. He kept telling her to go, so she went back to her bedroom with her brother and sister and called for help. She first called her grandmother, however the arguing got louder so she called the police.

From her bedroom, [REDACTED] then heard her parents go into the garage. She then began hearing her mother say, " just let me go, just let me go." Her father, on the other hand, was telling their mother to calm down. A short time later, [REDACTED] heard her mother at her [REDACTED] bedroom door asking to be let in. At first, [REDACTED] could not get the door open. When she finally did, her mom came in and [REDACTED] saw bright lights downstairs and realized the police were there.

[REDACTED] believes the argument started over her dad leaving her and her sisters home alone while their mother was working. Earlier tonight she woke up and realized he was gone so she texted her mother at work and told her. Her mother then left work early to come home.

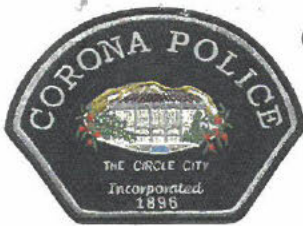
I also spoke with [REDACTED] sister, [REDACTED] (12 years old). The following is a summary of her recorded statement:

At about 0030, she heard her mom screaming "let me go" in her bedroom. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both ran to their parents' bedroom and opened the door and went inside. [REDACTED] observed her mother on her back on the floor near her bed. Her dad was on his knees over her with his hands on each of her shoulders, pinning her down to the ground. Her dad told them to "get out" and [REDACTED] did not know what to do. She said, "we didn't know what to do...we didn't know like, if we were like, supposed to grab something and hit him or something..." They then went back into her sister's room where [REDACTED] called police.

[REDACTED] said it calmed down momentarily, but then she began hearing them arguing in the garage. To her, it sounded as if he was trying to leave and their mom was telling him "go, go." [REDACTED] believes he stayed in the garage however her mom went outside through the front door, then came back in. She heard her mother say, "don't touch me...let me go...I just want to go inside the house with my kids." Her dad then said, "oh now you want to play victim?" Things then got quiet for a few moments and she heard her mom in the bathroom crying. She said things then got loud as her dad began throwing stuff and punching the walls downstairs. Their mom ran upstairs and tried going into her sister's bedroom where they had locked themselves in. At first the door would not open, but then her mom hit it open and went inside and locked the door. Her mom then told them, "call the police, call the police..."

Soon afterwards, the police arrived. Her dad began yelling "shoot me, shoot me in front of my kids..." however, they just put him in handcuffs. [REDACTED] said her father has a gun but she did not see him with it tonight. She thinks he keeps it somewhere in his car.

3 On Wednesday, February 3, 2016 at 0100 hours, I responded to the Corona
4 Police Department Traffic Conference room to Chart Corona Police Corporal
5 Ryan Kazsuk, who had just been involved in a shooting. Forensic Technician
6 Walker and Officer Tarrant met me in the conference room.

7
8 Technician Walker and I conducted a visual inspection of Corporal Kazsuk for
9 any evidence. Technician Walker photographed Corporal Kazsuk, his uniform,
10 his duty belt and pistol.

11
12 I saw Corporal Kazsuk was wearing his Corona Police Department approved,
13 Class B, short sleeve uniform, consisting of a dark blue shirt with standard
14 Corona Police patches on each shoulder, with two corporal chevrons underneath
15 the patches. Over his shirt, Corporal Kazsuk was wearing a Department
16 approved black jacket with a cloth Corona Police Department badge over the left
17 chest, and a Corona Police patch on each shoulder. Corporal Kazsuk had a
18 black watch cap with an embroidered "Corona Police" and an image of the
19 Corona Police badge. He had his Corona Police badge on his left chest and a
20 nameplate "Kazsuk" over his right chest pocket. Corporal Kazsuk was wearing
21 his duty belt, dark blue uniform pants and black boots.

22
23 On Corporal Kazsuk's leather duty belt was his leather key holder, with keys, his
24 holster with his Glock 17 Gen 4 in it, one handcuff case with handcuffs inside, his
25 pepper spray can holder with his Department issued pepper spray, a leather
26 flashlight holder with his flashlight, his issued hand held radio in a holder, a
27 holster with his Department issued Taser and a dual magazine pouch with two
28 magazines in them.

29
30 Corporal Kazsuk' pistol is a Glock 17 Gen4, serial number WCD563, chambered
31 in 9mm Parabellum. The holster is a Safariland with the SLS "hood" system.
32 The hood of the holster was in its' complete retention position.

33
34 I took the pistol out of the holster and started the clearing procedures. I took the
35 magazine out of the pistol and saw that it had eleven rounds of Department
36 issued Winchester 9mm Jacket Hollow Point ammunition. The magazine that
37 was in the pistol had a capacity of 17 rounds. I locked the slide of the pistol to
38 the rear and saw that another round of Winchester 9mm Jacketed Hollow Point
39 fell out of the chamber.

40
41 I then checked Corporal Kazsuk' magazine pouch and saw there were two
42 magazines in the pouch. I took the first magazine out and removed all of the
43 ammunition. The first magazine was loaded to capacity (17) with Department
44 issued Winchester 9mm Jacket Hollow Point ammunition. I then removed the

1 second magazine and saw that it too was loaded to capacity (17) with
2 Department issued Winchester 9mm Jacket Hollow Point ammunition.
3
4 I took possession of Corporal Kazsuk' pistol, the magazine and 11 rounds that
5 were in the magazine for later inspection, and checked them into the locked
6 shooting cabinet labeled "OIS" in the armory at the CPD.
7
8 At 0900 hours, Officer Tarrant and I drove the pistol, magazine and ammunition
9 to the Riverside office of The California Department of Justice. I logged in the
10 property to DOJ for testing and inspection.
11
12 On February 5, 2016, Officer Tarrant picked the handgun up from DOJ. Refer to
13 his supplemental report for more details.

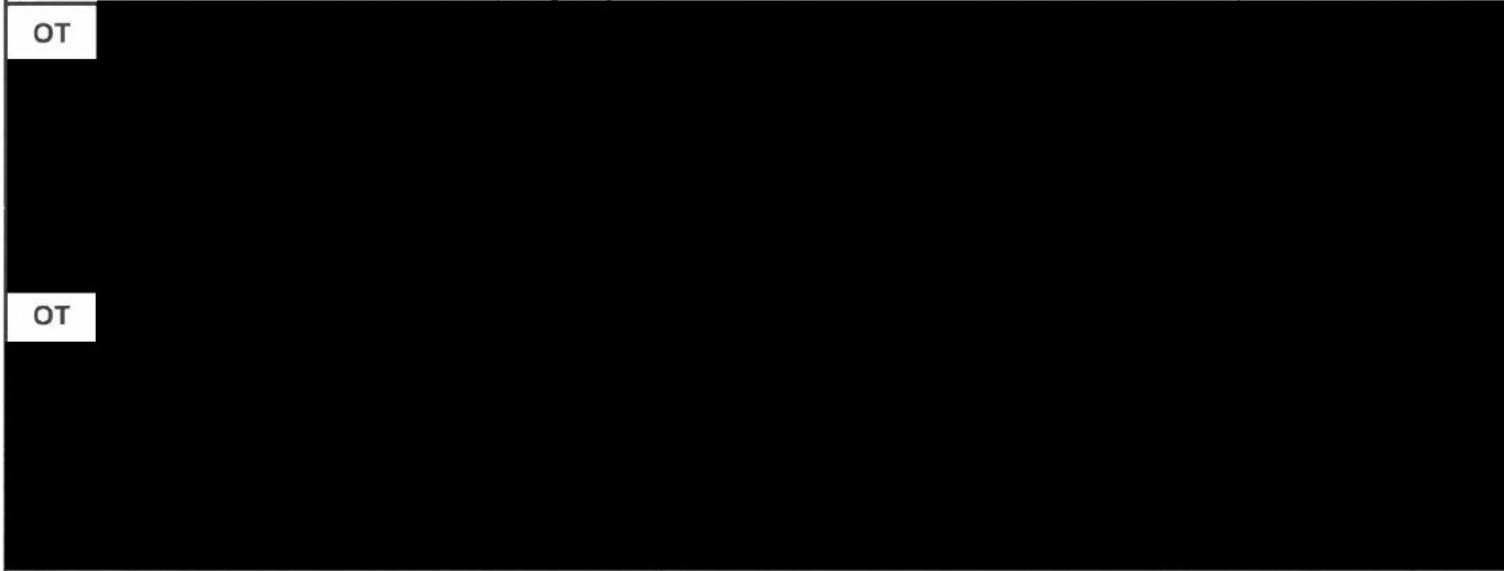

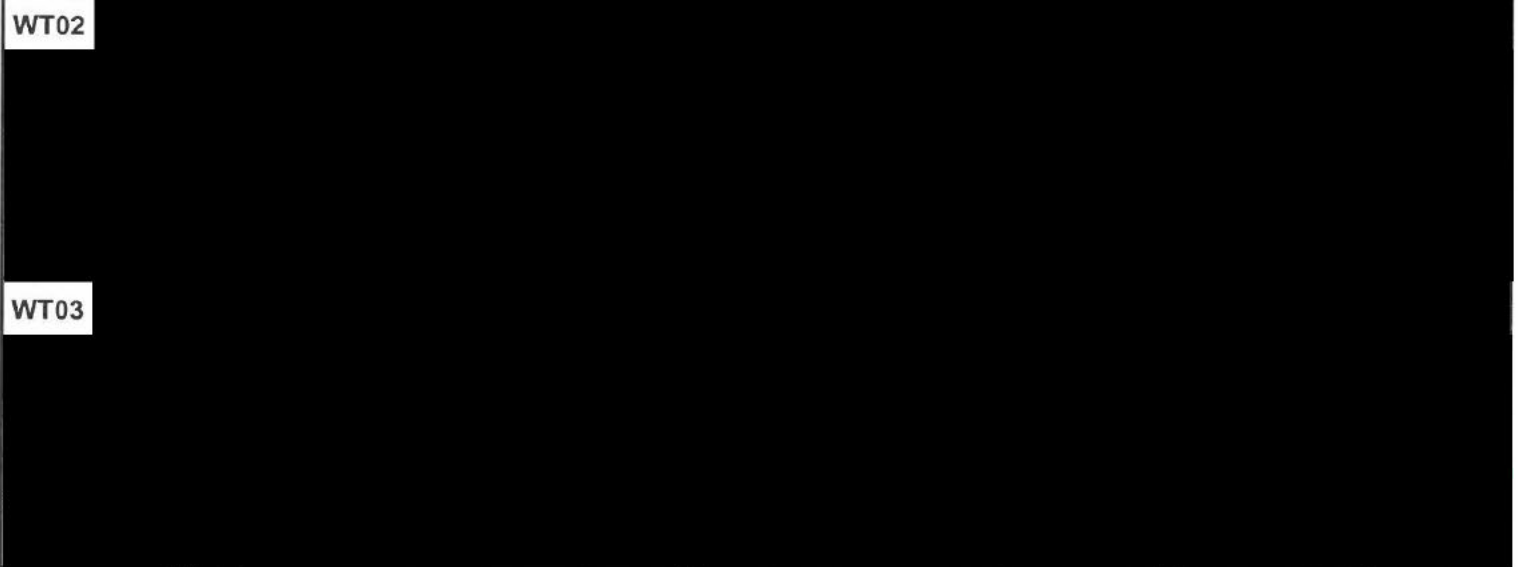

Background:

I am a Senior Detective with the Corona Police Department assigned to the Corona Police Departments Sex Crimes Unit. My duties include (but are not limited to) the investigation and identification of individuals involved in suspected sex crimes.

Details:

On **February 3, 2016** at about 0544 hours I contacted RCCAT Forensic Interviewer Jacklyn Saldana by phone to schedule an emergency forensic interview for three juveniles who were witnesses in a domestic dispute.

At about 0700 hours, same date, Detective Gottfried arrived with [REDACTED] along with her three children, (WT01) [REDACTED] (WT02) [REDACTED] and (WT03) [REDACTED] to the scheduled interview. The interview was conducted by the Riverside County Child Assessment Unit (**Project Kids**) located at 735 Public Safety Way, Corona CA 92880. The interviews were both audio/video recorded which was later formatted to a CD and logged into evidence at CPD.

Jacklyn Saldana, who is a forensic interviewer with CPS, conducted the interviews with all three juveniles. The following is a brief summary of WT02'S statement. A detailed statement is available on the CD.

Saldana began the interview by determining if [REDACTED] was capable of answering questions and providing specific details of the incident. During the interview [REDACTED] mentioned that sometime around 0100 hours her mother, [REDACTED] came home and was upset that her father, Keith Winn, had left her and her brother and sister alone. [REDACTED] said she had no idea her father was gone and had she known that she would have let her mom know.

[REDACTED] said that shortly after her mom came home she heard the sound of water being turned on indicating to her the shower was on. [REDACTED] believes that when her mom was taking a shower Keith showed up and soon after she heard arguing coming from her parent's bedroom. [REDACTED] said that she was in her room when she heard a "thump" sound coming from her parent's room. She went to investigate and upon doing so she saw that her mom [REDACTED] was being pinned on the floor by Keith. [REDACTED] said she yelled at Keith to, "Get off her" and he responded "shut up

and get back in the room". [REDACTED] then saw that her mom was crying and heard her say "its ok just go back to your room".

[REDACTED] said she took her sister [REDACTED] and her brother [REDACTED] into her bedroom and then called the police for help. [REDACTED] said that she first hesitated to call the police because it was her father. [REDACTED] said she wasn't going to let him hurt her mom so she proceeded to call the police.

[REDACTED] said that while she waited for the police to arrive things had calmed down between her parents for a short period of time. [REDACTED] said that after everything had calmed down for a while, things got "crazy" again. [REDACTED] said she could hear sounds coming from the downstairs area. [REDACTED] indicated to me that it sounded like her dad was breaking things. [REDACTED] said that her mom then went and followed her dad into the garage and a short time later she came back upstairs asking [REDACTED] to open her room.

[REDACTED] said that she was having difficulties opening her bedroom door and eventually had to kick it open. [REDACTED] said that once she was able to open her door, she heard the sound of "gun shots". [REDACTED] thought the gunshots were from Keith but then learned they were caused by the police. [REDACTED] told Jacklyn said that her mom later told her that she had planned on taking them out of the house while her dad was inside the garage.

Jacklyn then did a recap with [REDACTED] and got her to provide some additional details about what occurred. During the interview [REDACTED] indicated that the reason she remained awake after she was woken up by her parents arguing was because she knows her dad's past and knew that he would probably hurt her. During the arguing she could hear her mom say, "You left my kids at home to go get drunk". [REDACTED] said she called the police because she thought her dad was going to hurt her mom. Jacklyn asked if anyone else saw what happened and she replied yes, "her sister". When asked where her brother was she said, "Asleep". [REDACTED] said her sister saw what was happening because she came running behind her when she went to investigate.

Jacklyn then asked if she could provide any additional information about what occurred inside the garage. [REDACTED] said she has no idea how they got into the garage but she could hear arguing from that area because her room is above the garage. [REDACTED] could hear her mom say "calm down" followed by additional yelling and screaming between her parents. [REDACTED] then went downstairs to see what was happening. She told both her brother and sister to stay in the room while she went to check on her parents but they ignored her and followed her to the garage. [REDACTED] said she opened the door to look inside. [REDACTED] could see and hear that her dad was just yelling at her mom. When she closed the door she could hear her mom yell at her dad. [REDACTED] said she remained listening to make sure her dad didn't do anything to her mom. A short time later she and her brothers went back to her room. As she was inside her bedroom she spoke to her grandmother, [REDACTED] by phone and informed her of what had been going on. During this period [REDACTED] said she was crying because she was concerned about her mom. [REDACTED] said that her main concern was to make sure her mom was ok.

[REDACTED] said that her dad has always had an "anger problem" but never towards them. [REDACTED] described Keith as having a lot of aggression when he is upset like "he wants to hurt whatever hurt him". [REDACTED] said that when she does something bad she gets yelled at by her dad "not that serious". [REDACTED] said that Keith doesn't yell at her or her brother's in a manner that feels like he is going to hit them.

Jacklyn then asked [REDACTED] to tell her about the "shooting". [REDACTED] said that she did not see anything but she heard it from her room. [REDACTED] said it was loud with "a lot of shots". [REDACTED] thought her dad was killed. When asked who did the shooting [REDACTED] said it was the police. [REDACTED] said that she learned from talking with her mom that her dad had a gun. [REDACTED] indicated that her mom had knowledge of the gun because she kept it in the garage and told her dad he couldn't have it inside the house. [REDACTED] said she was told by her mom that her dad had been shot at because

he was coming into the house with a gun. [REDACTED] then started crying during the interview and mumbled some words followed by "he would try something like that". [REDACTED] continued to cry and stated "I don't even know what got into him today, or even try to hurt any of us". Jacklyn asked if she had seen the gun before and she said no. when asked if her mom had knowledge of a gun she said yes.

Jacklyn and [REDACTED] spoke for a short period longer but no additional details about the incident was provided and the interview was concluded.

Jacklyn then brought [REDACTED] to be interviewed. Saldana began the interview by determining if [REDACTED] was capable of answering questions and providing specific details of the incident. During the interview [REDACTED] provided a statement to Jacklyn that was similar to that provided by her sister [REDACTED] however added some additional information.

During [REDACTED] interview she indicated that her dad was home earlier in the evening and had made dinner for her, her brother and sister. [REDACTED] said that during their dinner, Keith asked all of them if they felt ok if he left, if they'd be "scared". [REDACTED] said that none of them said anything about it and afterwards they all went upstairs. [REDACTED] said that her mom had already told him not to leave but figured he probably left anyways after they went to sleep. [REDACTED] said she learned about it after her mom told the police.

When asked by Jacklyn if she saw her dad and mom argue inside their bedroom she said yes. When asked to describe what she saw she said her mom was on the floor crying while her dad was kneeling over her, holding her down, hands on her shoulders.

Sometime after she saw them in their bedroom, she stood by the stairway and saw her dad and mom walk downstairs then go outside. [REDACTED] said that when both her parents were outside in the driveway she heard something "hit" something and stated that "it sounded like his car window". [REDACTED] said the sound heard sounded like "broken glass". She said it wasn't till later when she went outside that she confirmed Keith's car had a broken window. When asked by Jacklyn how it happen [REDACTED] said, "I guess she hit it". [REDACTED] was asked why she thinks her mom broke the window. [REDACTED] explains she thinks her mom broke the window because when her dad came back into the house he said, "I didn't care about that car". [REDACTED] described her dad's car as a grey BMW. [REDACTED] was asked if her parents had anything in their hands when that walked outside. [REDACTED] indicated that her dad had keys in his hands and her mom had nothing in her hands.

[REDACTED] said that her parents then went into the garage after they came in. [REDACTED] knows this because she and her sister went to the garage and saw them inside. She said that her dad and mom were still arguing. [REDACTED] said that when they saw her dad in the garage, they noticed he was walking around in a way like he was looking for something.

[REDACTED] and her sister then went back upstairs and a short time later her mom came to her sister's room. [REDACTED] said they struggled trying to open the bedroom door but when they did, her home came in telling them to call the police not realizing the police had already been called. Seconds later, [REDACTED] said that they heard "shots" and that's when they knew the police were already there. [REDACTED] was asked how many shots she heard and she said she only heard "one" shot.

[REDACTED] was asked what she thought when she heard the shot. [REDACTED] said that everyone was asking if they thought her dad had been shot. [REDACTED] said "she doesn't even like her dad. When Jacklyn asked her to explain [REDACTED] said she and her dad do not have a good relationship because he was never there. [REDACTED] indicated Keith would only stop by randomly. She became upset when she learned Keith and her mom were getting back together about a year ago. [REDACTED] said that she has made her dislike of Keith known to her mom.

During the interview Jacklyn asked [REDACTED] what her mom told her about coming to the interview. She said that her mom didn't want to come to the interview because it was unnecessary. [REDACTED] said her mom didn't want the children to be questioned because she felt they were going to twist their words.

[REDACTED] was asked if she thought her dad was acting different today. [REDACTED] said he was acting more different than normal. She believes that he might have drunk something when he left the house. When asked if he takes drugs she said he smokes stuff that comes in a blue package.

[REDACTED] was asked if she has ever seen a gun in her house before she replied "yes". [REDACTED] said she has seen a gun in the garage before. She believes it belongs to her dad and is kept in the garage because her mom will not allow guns inside the house. [REDACTED] said she has seen the gun tucked in some chairs that are stacked near the area where she washes her clothes. She described the chairs as being blue and some being brown and foldable. She described the gun as not being inside anything and described it as being black. [REDACTED] then took a red marker and drew it on a piece of paper. She said the gun was about the size of the paper she was using.

[REDACTED] was asked if she had seen any other guns inside the house and she said "no". When asked if she had seen the gun she saw in the garage anywhere else she said "yes". She said she saw it in a drawer on her dad's side of the bed. [REDACTED] told Jacklyn that she didn't think her mom knew that the gun was inside the house because she had learned that he was told not to have a gun inside the house.

At this time there was no additional information obtained from [REDACTED] and the interview was concluded.

Details:

On February 3, 2016, I was called in to assist with an Officer Involved Shooting. I responded to the area of 1729 Greenview Avenue, Corona, Ca. Upon my arrival at the scene, I was contacted by Sergeant Avila who advised me to assist Forensic Technician Walker with documentation/diagramming the interior of the residence. I (with the assistance of Officer Najmulski) utilized a 50' steel measuring tape to obtain the measurements and was directed to only document the downstairs portion of the residence.

Detective Voorhees and Forensic Technician Walker documented evidence with placard numbers. Utilizing those placards, I used two measurements for the distances for placement in the drawing. All measurements were taken from the southern and easternmost walls of the residence. The southernmost wall of the residence was the garage door wall and the easternmost wall was the side garage wall.

2 On 02-05-16 at approximately 1540 hours I responded to CA Department of
3 Justice Criminalistics Laboratory located at 7425 Mission Blvd. Riverside CA
4 92509 to take possession of Cpl Kazsuk's firearm. I took possession of 1 Glock
5 17 Gen 4 serial number WCD563 and 1 Glock 17 magazine (see attached

8 On 02-05-16 at approximately 1640 hours I conducted a Post Shooting
9 Inspection on the listed firearm. I am a Glock Certified Armorer. I first verified the
10 serial numbers, make and model matched, they did, Glock 17 Gen 4 serial
11 number WCD563. The weapon is owned by Cpl Kazsuk, he uses this firearm for
12 patrol duties. This is an authorized weapon to carry as a side arm. The only none
13 factory parts on the weapon are a Pachmayr rubber grip (authorized) and a
14 Surefire X300 Ultra weapon light (authorized).

16 Cpl Kazsuk had successfully passed the last handgun qualification on 12-11-15
17 which was supervised by Rangemaster Cpl Snow. Cpl Kazsuk's handgun had
18 passed the annual inspection performed by myself (Glock certified armorer) on

21 I performed a function check on the weapon, it passed. I test fired the weapon, it
22 performed flawlessly. I stripped down the firearm to conduct an inspection of

3 On 02/03/16 at 0130 hours I was contacted by Sergeant R. Avila and asked to
4 respond to the Corona Police Department reference an officer involved shooting
5 investigation. At approximately 0230 hours I arrived at the Corona Police Department
6 traffic conference room. Upon arrival I met with Corporal R. Kazsuk who was involved
7 in the shooting. Also present was Sergeant J. Perez, Corporal J. Waldon and Officer M.
8 Tarrant. With the assistance of Sergeant Perez overall photographs of Corporal Kazsuk
9 were taken including his uniform, duty belt and firearms (see Sergeant Perez' report for
10 full details on the firearm charting).

11
12 On 02/03/16 at approximately 0337 hours I then responded to 1729 Greenview
13 Ave. where I met with Detective B. Voorhees who provided me with the circumstances
14 of this case. Detective Voorhees requested that overview photographs of the front of
15 1729 Greenview be taken while a warrant was being secured for the interior. While
16 waiting Detective G. Gottfried made contact with me and requested I take overview
17 photographs of [REDACTED]

18
19 At approximately 0800 hours Detective Voorhees requested photographs of the
20 area north of 1729 Greenview Ave., which included Corporal Kazsuk's patrol unit and
21 path traveled.

22
23 At approximately 0900 hours Detective D. Bloomfield made contact with me and
24 requested I take overview photographs of the interior of 1729 Greenview Ave. Per
25 Detective Bloomfield I then photographed the exterior garage roll up door including the
26 damage to the glass window at the top of the door. Measurements of the window and
27 garage door were also photographed. Photos from the exterior roll up garage door,
28 through the broken window were also taken to document Corporal Kazsuk's vantage
29 point.

30 Detective Bloomfield then placed orange markers along with lettered stickers A-F
31 next to each defect located inside the garage and residence to document them. It was at
32 this time that attempts to locate suitable defects for reconstruction or trajectory analysis

40 and item (LW11-Smith & Wesson 40) per Bloomfield's request DNA swabs were
41 collected from both firearms and magazines.

EVIDENCE:

CD with audio recording of statements made by [REDACTED] relating to consent to search the residence, to come to the station, and about events that occurred prior to the arrival of officers. – CD was logged into Property at the Corona PD.

DETAILS:

On 2-3-16 at about 0059 Hrs. I arrived on scene at 1729 Greenview after hearing Cpl. Kzsuk announce on the radio that there had been an "OIS."

As I approached the front of the house, I saw the suspect, Keith Winn, lying face down on the ground handcuffed, just outside the front door. As officers began clearing the house Cpl. Kzsuk asked me to assist him with taking the suspect out of the scene and into a police car.

I assisted in helping the suspect to his feet after Cpl. Kzsuk told me that Winn was not injured. I helped raise Winn to a standing position by his arms as he was standing. As I did so, I asked him if he was injured. He turned and leaned down toward me and began shouting at me that there were kids in his house and we had shot at him. As he shouted at me I could smell the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath.

I assisted with placing Winn in the back of Sgt. Gamache's unit. I then left Winn in the custody of Sgt. Gamache.

I went back to the house and supervised patrol personnel at the scene.

Turned on my digital audio recorder and talked to OT [REDACTED] and asked her for consent to search the house to gather evidence related to the incident. Initially [REDACTED] gave consent, but for the downstairs only, and then stated she didn't want officers or detectives to search any part of her residence.

I also asked [REDACTED] if she and the children were willing to come to the police station because detectives would want to talk to her. [REDACTED] said she would come to the station but did not want her children to come.

I then allowed [REDACTED] to remain upstairs while detective personnel responded to take over the scene.

While talking briefly to [REDACTED] she told me what had happened in the house prior to police arriving. The conversation was captured on my audio recorder.

On 2/4/16 I reviewed the statement [REDACTED] had made to Officer Renstrom as documented in his initial report. The statement documented by Officer Renstrom is consistent with the statements she made to me.

In addition to statements covered in Officer Renstrom's report, [REDACTED] said she Winn drinks and smokes marijuana every day and that he has a medical marijuana card.

She said after the argument started that he was "not himself." He was "crazy." She tried to calm him down and there was no calming him down.

When he was down in the garage he was just going around in circles. When she realized he was crazy she was just going to get out of the house. She went upstairs to get the kids and told them to "call the police, call the police, call the police."

When she was arguing with him at the garage door she was crying and upset and she realized;

"He's crazy. I got to get it together. Like, you know so I stopped crying I'm like trying to calm him down, so I'm like oh my God, he's gon, he's on, he's, ya like, I don't know what he is going to do. Like he's crazy. Like he is going to kill me, and like, you know I'm sayin', he's crazy."

I later released the scene to detectives.

I copied my digital audio recording to a CD and logged it into Property at the Corona PD.

13 referred to by their first names. The following is a summary of the interview
14 noted. For further details and a more complete record of the interview, refer
15 to the recordings.

17 **Riverside Police Departments 9-1-1 CALL:** I requested a copy of the 9-1-1
18 call that was transferred from Riverside Police Department from Lieutenant
19 Steven Bradshaw. (See attached request form for further.) I reviewed a copy of
20 the 9-1-1 call that was placed by [REDACTED]. This is a summary of what was said.
21 During the call [REDACTED] is crying and upset. The male RPD dispatcher asked
22 [REDACTED] if her dad was hitting or yelling at her mom and she responded by
23 saying, "Both." [REDACTED] is transferred to the Corona Police Department where
24 she stated a second time that her dad is yelling and hitting her mom. (See
25 recording for further.)

1 **DETAILS:**

2
3 On 02-03-2016, at 0150 hours, I was notified by phone that there was an
4 Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) at 1729 Greenview Avenue in the city of
5 Corona. I responded to the scene to obtain by assignment from Sergeant R.
6 Avila. I was asked to interview (OT01) [REDACTED] and
7 obtain her statement. I made contact with [REDACTED] inside the residence near
8 the upstairs landing. This is a summary of my digital audio recorded statement.
9 (Present during the first part of the interview was Detective J. Samano. The
10 majority of the interview was conducted in the master bedroom behind closed
11 doors with [REDACTED])
12

13 [REDACTED] did not want to speak with me initially and would not allow us to
14 speak with her children. [REDACTED] wanted information as to why the shooting
15 occurred. She advised that one of the firearms that were located downstairs
16 was (SU01) Keith Bernard Winn's but stated the other was not. (It was later
17 determined in an interview with Keith that he admitted that both firearms at
18 the scene were his. See Detective B. Voorhees investigative report for further.)
19 I asked [REDACTED] if she had seen the gun (little black one) before and she
20 advised that she had seen it in the garage to their residence approximately a
21 month ago. [REDACTED] said when she had seen the gun originally in the garage
22 she told Keith that she did not want any guns in her house.
23

24 [REDACTED] stated that Keith came home and started arguing with her. She
25 advised that he was drunk and probably "high." I asked [REDACTED] if Keith hurt
26 her tonight and she stated, "No." I asked [REDACTED] if she hurt Keith tonight
27 and she stated, "No." I asked [REDACTED] what the argument was about tonight
28 and she told me, "Because he went out drinking." [REDACTED] stated that Keith
29 drinks and smokes marijuana and was certain he had smoked tonight. She said
30 she doesn't know if he got some "bad stuff" because of the way he was acting.
31 She stated what upset her was that he left the kids while he went out and didn't
32 put the alarm on.
33

34 [REDACTED] stated she received a call from her 15 year old daughter, [REDACTED]
35 that her dad (Keith) wasn't home. [REDACTED] checked her security cameras via
36 phone and noticed that Keith's vehicle (BMW) was not in the driveway.
37 [REDACTED] called Keith twice and he didn't answer his cell phone. She decided
38 that she was going to leave work and go home. She said she left at
39 approximately 2330 hours and arrived home approximately 20 minutes later.

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1 On the way home she received a call from Keith. Keith was asking her what
2 her problem was. They started arguing and [REDACTED] hung up on Keith. Keith
3 called her back and the argument continued. [REDACTED] stated that she was upset
4 that he left the residence and didn't set the alarm.

5
6 When she arrived home Keith was not there. She said she decided to take a
7 shower and ultimately heard the garage door open. She was in the master
8 bathroom/master bedroom area when Keith came upstairs and got in her face.
9 [REDACTED] stated she has a strong personality but realized by the way Keith was
10 acting she "wasn't about to go there with him." Keith told her that he could
11 do whatever the "fuck" he wants to and go wherever the "fuck" he wants to
12 go. [REDACTED] stated she felt like she was being disrespected. She stated that she
13 pays the bills in the house and was not going to be talked to in that manner.
14 Keith started calling [REDACTED] names (bitch) and that upset her.

15
16 Keith told her that he was going to leave. She stated that she should have
17 just let him leave but she didn't want him to go. She said at that point she was
18 mad and blocked the double doors to the master bedroom. She told him that
19 he was not going to take any of the vehicles because they are her vehicles. (It
20 should be noted that the BMW is also in Keith's name.) She told him that if he
21 was going to leave that he needed to take all of his clothes and to not come
22 back. He tried to open the master bedroom door and they started wrestling
23 with each other. She said that she was trying to prevent him from leaving. She
24 said that during this incident no one ever hit each other.

25
26 During the squabble, [REDACTED] stated, "He probably pushed me out of the
27 way" or she stated she could have tripped. She said she fell to the ground and
28 landed on her back. Keith was on top of her holding her down. She stated that
29 her arms were above her head and his hands were around her wrists. She told
30 Keith to let her up but he wouldn't. She started yelling for him to let her go.
31 She said that's when all of the kids opened the door to their bedroom and the
32 kids were telling Keith to let her go. She stated that Keith let her go.

33
34 [REDACTED] stated that she was mad because Keith was holding her down.
35 Keith told her that he was still leaving and walked out of the master bedroom
36 and down the stairs. [REDACTED] followed Keith. Keith went into the garage and
37 that's when she knew he was going to leave. She said she went out the front
38 door to try and stop him. She grabbed a glass bottle/jar from inside the garage
39 and shattered the windshield (BMW). I asked [REDACTED] where Keith was at the

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1 time that she threw the bottle and she told me he was standing in the garage. (It
2 should be noted that in [REDACTED] initial statement to Officer Renstrom she
3 stated that Keith was inside the vehicle when the bottle had been thrown.)
4 [REDACTED] stated that she was crying and hysterical.

5
6 Keith told [REDACTED] to get in the house. She said he was concerned about
7 the neighbors seeing them argue. She stated that she came in through the
8 garage and he shut the garage door. She stated they continued to argue in the
9 garage. Keith continued to tell her to calm down and that she was taking
10 things too far. She stated she was crying because she was emotional. She said
11 the kids were at the top of the stairs. She stated that her son, [REDACTED] came
12 downstairs with his phone. [REDACTED] showed [REDACTED] that he had called his
13 grandma, [REDACTED], and was attempting to give her the phone. She said that
14 when Keith found out that [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] that "set him off." She said
15 that Keith and [REDACTED] don't get along.

16
17 [REDACTED] stated when they were downstairs in the entry way she told Keith
18 to leave. She stated that at this point he didn't want to leave. She said she was
19 crying and begging him to leave. [REDACTED] stated at some point Keith punched
20 a hole in the wall located downstairs near the entryway and stairs. [REDACTED]
21 stated that Keith's behavior was up and down. She said he got all worked up
22 again. He was telling her how she started "shit" and now the kids are upset.

23
24 Keith then went back into the garage and she followed him. Keith started
25 yelling, "Fuck this shit, fuck this shit." [REDACTED] stated that he was getting real
26 psycho. She stated she couldn't remember half the stuff he was saying but
27 when he stated, "Them mother fucking kids." She was concerned because he
28 has never spoken like that about them. She stated Keith was upset because the
29 kids didn't do their chores and hadn't picked up the dog poop. Keith continued
30 to say fuck them kids and that he was tired of them. [REDACTED] stated when
31 Keith kept making those comments that she was afraid that he was going to
32 hurt her and the kids. She said when he said, "Fuck the kids." She felt he was
33 going to harm the kids.

34
35 [REDACTED] stated at that point she needed to leave with the kids. She
36 continued to tell him to calm down and he wasn't. She said she thought at
37 some point he took something and threw it up against the wall in the garage
38 but couldn't recall what he threw. She said he kept walking around in circles
39 and it looked like he was looking for something. [REDACTED] started to think that

1 maybe he was looking for the gun and realized she needed to get out of the
2 house. [REDACTED] stated that she was leaving because she wasn't going to remain
3 at the residence with "that crazy person." She stated that he was acting like he
4 had no sense.

5
6 [REDACTED] went upstairs to get the kids from the locked upstairs bedroom.
7 [REDACTED] was knocking on the door telling [REDACTED] to open the door. While she
8 was outside waiting for [REDACTED] to open the door she heard approximately 6 to
9 7 gun shots and then stated approximately 5 to 10 gun shots. [REDACTED] stated
10 when she heard the gun shots she originally thought that Keith was shooting.
11 She stated she was able to get inside the kids bedroom. When she finally
12 opened the bedroom door she realized the police were inside her house. (See
13 recording for further.)
14

15 I explained to [REDACTED] that we needed to interview her children since they
16 were present during the incident. Forensic interviews were scheduled at
17 Project Kids by Detective J. Samano. (See Detective Samano's supplemental
18 report for further.) On 02-03-2016, at approximately 0704 hours, Forensic
19 Interviewer Jackie Saldana made contact with (VM01) [REDACTED] 8
20 years old, in the interview room at Project Kids which is located in the 700
21 block of Public Safety Way. The interview room is recorded via a closed circuit
22 (digital) audio-visual system. I viewed this interview during real time in the
23 other room. I later put the DVD-ROM containing the recording of the
24 interview in the evidence locker at the Corona Police Department. This is a
25 summary of what was said.
26

27 During the interview, Jackie laid the foundation on how to answer questions
28 in her "talking room." The following was conveyed to the victim to make sure
29 he understood. The victim was advised if he didn't know the answer to a
30 question it was okay to say that he doesn't know. Jackie practiced with the
31 victim and stated, "What's my dog's name?" The victim replied, "I don't
32 know." Jackie told the victim that if she makes a mistake or says the wrong
33 thing she wants the victim to correct her. Jackie practiced with the victim and
34 told him that he was 30 years old. The victim told her that she was wrong.
35 Jackie further explained to the victim that if she asks him something that he
36 doesn't understand she wants the victim to tell her. Jackie practiced with the
37 victim and asked him what his gender was. The victim advised that he didn't
38 understand. Jackie then asked the victim if he was a boy or a girl and he stated
39 a boy.

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1
2 Based upon the victim's answers to the questions, it was clear he had a good
3 understanding on how to communicate in the talking room. Jackie stressed the
4 importance of telling the truth and about things that really happen. The victim
5 stated that he would tell the truth and would not tell any lies. The victim was
6 asked if he knew why he was here today and he stated that he didn't know.

7
8 The victim was asked if the police have ever been to his house before and
9 he shook his head no. Jackie would ask the victim questions in reference to the
10 police and being called out to his residence. The victim would reply to multiple
11 questions saying that he didn't know. Jackie would then clarify with the victim
12 whether or not he knew or just didn't want to talk about it. The victim would
13 say that he didn't want to talk about it. The victim was asked why he didn't
14 want to talk about it and he replied, "I just don't." The victim stated that he
15 didn't feel really happy about talking about it.

16
17 The victim was asked how his mom and Keith got along in their
18 relationship and he replied, "Good." The victim was asked to talk about his
19 mom and Keith and how they get along. The victim would continue to say that
20 he didn't know. The victim was asked how he felt and he stated, "Sad." The
21 victim was extremely reluctant to say what happened the night in question.
22 When the victim was asked what he told the police he stated that he didn't talk
23 to the police. When asked again he stated that he couldn't remember what he
24 told the officer.

25
26 Jackie asked the victim why the police were there and he stated, "Keith went
27 to jail." The victim was asked if he thought that Keith should go to jail and the
28 victim stated yes. The victim advised that he likes that Keith is in jail but
29 wouldn't say why he did. (See recording for further.)

30
31 I then spoke with (OT02) [REDACTED] **grandma to the victim**, at
32 Project Kids located in the 700 block of Public Safety Way in the city of
33 Corona. This is a summary of [REDACTED] digital audio recorded statement. It
34 should be noted that as I was attempting to talk with [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
35 became upset in the other room. I heard her ask Officer L. Larios why I
36 needed to speak with [REDACTED] if she wasn't present at the time of the incident.

37
38 I asked [REDACTED] to tell me about the conversation she had with [REDACTED] over
39 the telephone. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] called her and stated that her mom

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1 and dad were fighting. She stated that she was crying and decided she was
2 going to drive out to their residence in Corona. I asked [REDACTED] if she had
3 called other family members once she got off the phone with [REDACTED] and she
4 told me no. She did however say that she called [REDACTED] because she had lost
5 connection with [REDACTED]
6

7 I asked [REDACTED] how she would describe the relationship between [REDACTED]
8 and Keith and she couldn't provide an answer. I asked [REDACTED] if she liked
9 Keith and she told me that he was okay. I asked her if she was aware of Keith
10 owning a firearm and she stated no.(See recording for further.)
11

12 **JAIL PHONE CALLS:** I reviewed the Corona Jail phone calls that were
13 made by (SU01) Keith Bernard Winn. The following was revealed. Keith
14 called [REDACTED] and an unknown female. (See attached documents for further.)
15 Keith admits during the conversations that both of the firearms are his.
16 [REDACTED] told Keith that he got "crazy" that night and that he was "out of
17 control." She told him that she doesn't know if he smoked too much stuff or
18 was drunk but repeatedly told him that he was acting crazy. Keith told
19 [REDACTED] that they were just arguing and that's what scared the kids.
20

21 During a conversation with an unknown female with a phone number of [REDACTED]
22 [REDACTED], Keith advised that he wouldn't want [REDACTED] arrested but if his
23 back was up against the wall than she should go to jail because she was the
24 aggressor in the incident. (See recording for further.)
25

1 **Summary:** On 02-03-16, at approximately 0044 hours, Corona police dispatch
2 received a 911 call from 1729 Greenview Ave, Corona CA. The female caller
3 stated that her parents were involved in a verbal and physical altercation within
4 the home. CPD officers were dispatched and responded to the location. Upon the
5 arrival of officers, Cpl. Kazsuk heard yelling coming from the home and observed
6 a male subject (later identified as Kevin Keith) in the garage that appeared to be
7 angry and agitated. Cpl. Kazsuk observed Keith with a handgun in his hands and
8 was attempting to enter the home through a door in the garage that leads into the
9 house.

10
11 Fearing for the safety of the occupants of the home, officers were involved in a
12 shooting of Keith and his subsequent arrest. Keith was not struck by any bullets
13 or injured and did not require any medical treatment. He was then transported to
14 CPD for further investigation. While at the police station, a blood sample was
15 obtained from Keith by American Forensic Nurses and submitted for analysis.
16 *See attached Service Request.*

17
18 **Note:** SU Keith Winn consented to a search of his cellular phone that I had
19 earlier seized at his residence. He also consented for his blood to be analyzed.
20 *See attached Consent to Search forms.*

29 **Details:** On 2-3-16 at approximately 0130 hours, I was asked to respond to
30 assist with an officer involved shooting (OIS) that resulted during the
31 investigation of a domestic violence call by patrol officers. I arrived on scene at
32 approximately 0245 hours. After being briefed by Sgt. Sears who was the on-
33 scene supervisor of the circumstances, I assigned Sr. Det. Bloomfield to obtain a
34 search warrant for the residence to collect and process any items of evidence
35 that may be present.

36
37 I was informed that Ofcr Renstrom was one of the first officers on scene and also
38 obtained a brief statement from VM [REDACTED] *Refer to his initial report*
39 *for further details.*

40
41 VM [REDACTED] and her children were transported to CPD where they were
42 interviewed by Det. Gottfried and Det. Samano. *Refer to their supplemental*
43 *reports for further details.*

2 Det. Bloomfield wrote and obtained a search warrant for the residence and
3 vehicles as well as the DNA collection and photos of SU Keith Winn. The search
4 warrant was signed by the Honorable Judge T. Cahraman of the Riverside
5 County Superior Court.

6 During a search of the residence, two handguns were found lying on the floor in
7 the living room- *See attached photos*. The first handgun was a Taurus, 9mm,
8 semi-automatic with a magazine in place. The magazine had a capacity of 7
9 rounds and contained 7 rounds. The second gun was Smith & Wesson .40
10 caliber with a magazine in place. The magazine had a capacity of 14 rounds and
11 contained 9 rounds. I was present and witnessed both of these handguns being
12 secured and inspected prior to being collected as evidence. Neither of the
13 weapons had a bullet in the chamber.

14
15 After the residence had been photographed and evidence items were identified
16 and collected, I returned to the police station to interview SU Keith Winn.

17
18 Det. Gottfried and I then contacted and escorted Keith to an interview room
19 located in the lobby of the police department. The interview room was both
20 audio/video recorded which was formatted to a DVD and logged into evidence by
21 Det. Gottfried. Prior to interviewing Keith, I advised him of his rights per Miranda
22 by reading directly from CPD Form 30-011. Keith understood these rights and
23 agreed to speak with me. See attached Miranda Admonishment form. The
24 following is a summary of his statement. *Refer to recorded interview for further*
25 *details.*

26
27 Keith stated that the night before, he went to a bar in Upland with his friend [REDACTED]
28 [REDACTED] He also admitted to smoking a small amount of marijuana earlier in day of
29 2-2-16. Keith stated that neither the marijuana nor alcohol had impaired his
30 judgement. He admitted to drinking one beer while out and said that he had been
31 at the bar for approximately 45 minutes to an hour before he received a call from
32 his wife [REDACTED]. He could tell by her voice that she was upset. Keith
33 said that he returned home at approximately midnight.

34
35 When he arrived home, [REDACTED] began to yell at the top of her lungs about
36 different issues. He said that [REDACTED] thinks he is having an affair and that he is
37 not working at the time and always reminds him of that. He said that they were
38 arguing in the master bedroom and the time was about 0024 hours. Keith said he
39 knew where the argument was heading and decided to leave. He stated that he
40 was going to get some clothes and also take his gun that he has in the
41 nightstand next to his bed. He stated that he owns two guns, and that the other
42 one is kept in the garage. He said the gun in the drawer was black with a gray
43 slide (identified as the Smith & Wesson).

2 Keith stated that as he was attempting to leave the bedroom, [REDACTED] blocked
3 his path as he approached the door to prevent him from leaving. He said that
4 during this time he pushed her aside with his left hand. She grabbed onto to him
5 and caused him to turn with her and both of them fell to the floor. He said that
6 she fell on her back and that he was on his knees, he said that he was not
7 straddling her. Keith does not recall where the gun was at that time. He said that
8 [REDACTED] began to hit him in the face with her hands. Keith said that he recalls
9 holding her right hand with his left hand to prevent her from hitting him. He stated
10 that during this time, the kids opened the bedroom door and saw them on the
11 floor. Keith said he motioned with his right hand and told them to get out.
12

13 Keith said he was able to get up and exited the bedroom and proceeded
14 downstairs. He does not recall picking up his gun and believes it was possibly
15 still in his hand. He stated that everything happened so quickly that he does not
16 remember if he picked it up. He stated that [REDACTED] followed him and they were
17 now standing near the living room and entry where they continued to argue. Keith
18 stated that out of frustration, he yelled "Fuck" and punched a wall. He then went
19 to the garage to retrieve his other handgun out of the cabinet before he left. He
20 said that he now had both guns in his left hand. He opened the garage door in an
21 attempt to leave the residence but [REDACTED] followed him to the garage.
22

23 Before Keith was able to get into his car, [REDACTED] grabbed two glass jars and
24 threw them at his vehicle. One caused his windshield to shatter; the other caused
25 a dent on the side of his vehicle. **Note:** During a search of the residence, two
26 glass mason jars were located on the street and damage was observed on his
27 vehicle.
28

29 Keith said that due to the loudness of their argument he decided not to leave and
30 attempted to calm [REDACTED] down. He then closed the garage door. While still in
31 the garage, he continued to tell [REDACTED] to, "Calm down, calm down." Keith said
32 that he became frustrated and threw both of his guns at the wall in the garage.
33 **Note:** I noted damage to the drywall in the garage which was consistent with his
34 statement. [REDACTED] then walked away and went in the house threw the door that
35 leads into the house. He believes that [REDACTED] left because she was calming
36 down and may have come to her senses.
37

38 Keith said he then picked up the guns and noticed that the magazine of one of
39 the guns had fallen out. He then replaced the magazine and tried to dust off the
40 drywall debris.
41

42 Keith stated that he then realized that he could no longer leave due to the
43 situation, such as the yelling, items being thrown and the scene that had been

1 created. He said that putting the guns in his car after he had been drinking earlier
2 and trying to drive off would have been a problem. He said that he and [REDACTED]
3 have had arguments before and thought that since there was not more yelling
4 and that she went back inside that the situation would smooth itself over.
5

6 Keith decided to stay at his home and was proceeding to walk into the house. As
7 he was getting ready to open the door, he heard gunshots and felt something
8 zipping past his head. He fell to the tile floor which caused the guns to fall from
9 his hands. Keith stated he did not hear any voices prior to the shots, but once on
10 the floor inside the house, he heard noises at the front door and kicking. He then
11 identified the police by sight. They then told him, "Don't move, don't move, don't
12 move." He was handcuffed and taken into custody and eventually transported to
13 the police station.
14

15 Based on the statements of VM [REDACTED] and both the actions and statements of
16 SU Keith Winn; such as his earlier consumption of alcohol, smoking marijuana
17 and possessing a loaded firearm while involved in a verbal/physical domestic
18 dispute and the throwing of those weapons, I believe that he posed a significant
19 risk of great bodily injury or death to his children who were present in the home.
20

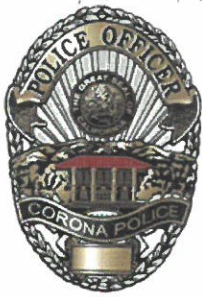
21 His actions fit the criteria outlined below per penal code section 273a(a) PC:
22

23 273a. (a) Any person who, under circumstances or conditions likely
24 to produce great bodily harm or death, willfully causes or permits
25 any child to suffer, or inflicts thereon unjustifiable physical pain
26 or mental suffering, or having the care or custody of any child,
27 willfully causes or permits the person or health of that child to be
28 injured, or willfully causes or permits that child to be placed in a
29 situation where his or her person or health is endangered, shall be
30 punished by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year, or
31 in the state prison for two, four, or six years.
32

33 An Emergency Protective Order was obtained and served to Keith while still in
34 custody at CPD. The order prohibits any contact between Keith and his wife
35 [REDACTED] and three children. A bail increase was also sought and obtained per
36 penal code section 1269c PC- See attached documents.

38 I advised Keith that he was being arrested for 3 counts of 273a(a) PC. He was
39 later transported to the Riverside County Jail.

14 On 2/4/2016, about 1411 hours, I retrieved the suspect's mobile phone from Forensic Technician
15 Lynsey Walker in the forensics office. The phone was in a sealed evidence envelope when I
16 received it.

17

18 I took the phone to the computer laboratory and removed it from the envelope. I photographed
19 the phone, placed it in airplane mode, and removed the PIN code to prevent it from interfering
20 with the data extraction process. I next connected it to a Cellebrite UFED (Universal Forensic
21 Extraction Device) Touch and performed a file system extraction. The data from the phone was
22 saved to a hard drive that I had previously erased with HDD Low Level Format Tool version 4.40.
23 This program securely erases by removing all partitions and writing zeros to the entire accessible
24 storage area.

25

26 Once the extraction process was complete, I used Cellebrite Physical Analyzer version 4.5.1.13 to
27 decode the supported data and generate a report in UFDR format. This format creates a single
28 data file that is viewed with the included UFED Reader program. This program does not need to
29 be installed and merely needs to be executed on a Windows computer. The user may then view

1 the various categories, such as chat, call logs, device locations, etc., and also generate additional
2 reports.

3

4 I also used Physical Analyzer to generate a timeline report from 2/2/2016 at 1800 hours to
5 2/3/2016 at 0100 hours. This report was generated in HTML format. I also generated a report of
6 the same date and time range, but only with the contact "Kiki" (possibly the suspect's wife). This
7 report was also in HTML format.

8

9 The data extracted from the phone and the reports were saved to an evidence hard drive in the
10 directory 16-1380-iPhone.

11

12 The phone was given to Detective B. Voorhees on 2/10/2016, about 0745 hours. I also provided
13 Detective B. Voorhees a copy of the timeline reports for his review.

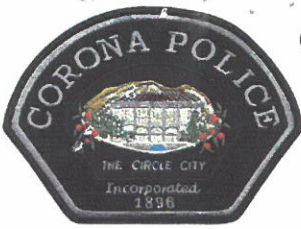

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1 The following photo shows the perspective of Cpl. Kazsuk as he was looking
2 through the garage door window into the garage. He fired through a window that
3 was intact causing it to break; evidence of the breakage was found at the scene.
4 You can also see the interior door leading into the residence from this point.

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Per measurements taken on scene, the distance from the roll-up garage door to the interior door was 23'. Also at this location outside the garage door, 6 bullet casings were recovered that were fired from Cpl. Kazsuk's handgun. Refer to *Forensic Tech Walkers supplemental report for further details.*

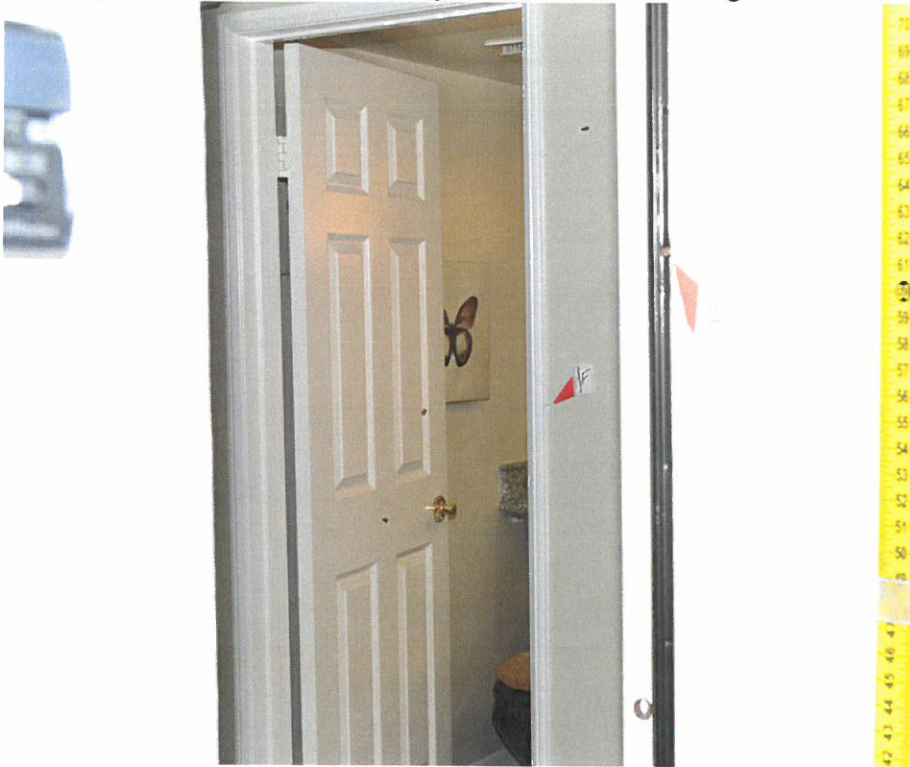

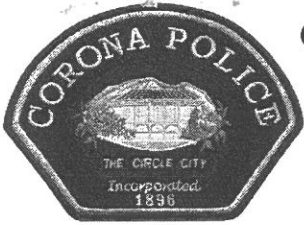



Commanding Officer's Administrative Insight:

In August 2016, Lt. Sergio Banales completed the criminal investigative review of the officer involved shooting involving Detective Ryan Kazsuk. The criminal investigative report was forwarded to the Riverside County District Attorney's Office for review. On December 20, 2016, Riverside County District Attorney Michael Hestrin, with the assistance of Chief Assistant District Attorney, John Aki completed the review of the criminal investigation and concluded that there is no evidence of criminal liability on Detective Ryan Kazsuk's part.

On May 18, 2017, Senior Detective Andy Bryant submitted a memorandum to Lt. Sergio Banales regarding the OIS Administrative Report #16-1380. After reviewing Senior Detective Bryant's report, I concur with his findings that Detective Ryan Kazsuk were within department policy and procedure as it relates to the use of force, CPDM: Section 300 – Use of Force. Per CPDM 302.2.1, "the Division Commander will objectively evaluate the use of force by its members to ensure that their authority is used lawfully, appropriately and is consistent with training and policy." The Division Commander of the employee involved in the incident will determine if a need exists for a Force Review Panel. I conferred with Field Services Division Captain James Patton, along with a review of Senior Detective Bryant's administrative report, Sergeant Jeff Edward's civil report, and all criminal reports, witness statements, audio / video recordings. We then determined that the officer's actions were reasonable within department policy. Therefore, there was no need to convene a Use of Force Review Board.

Corrective Action:

The use of force was determined to be within department policy.

INCIDENT SUMMARY:

On Wednesday, February 3, 2016, at 0044 hours, Corporal Kazsuk was working his regular-duty shift, Morning Watch, when he was dispatched to 1729 Greenview Avenue regarding a domestic violence incident. The caller, 15 year-old [REDACTED] reported that her mother and father were physically fighting and her father had her mother “pinned down.”

[REDACTED] described her father, the suspect in this incident, Keith Winn, as a black male adult wearing a black shirt. She also said there has been domestic violence between the two of them before. [REDACTED] said she was locked in her bedroom with her 12 year-old brother and 8 year-old sister.

Cpl. Kazsuk arrived at about 0049 hours and was the only officer on-scene at the time. He noticed an empty Mason jar in the street in front of 1729 Greenview and approached the garage door. Seeing the interior of the garage was lit, he looked through one of the windows along the top of the garage door. Cpl. Kazsuk saw an African –American female in her underwear, standing near the door that leads from the garage to the house. He also saw a male, later identified as Keith Winn, in the garage, wearing dark clothing. Cpl. Kazsuk saw Keith angrily tear a panel off a furnace that was just inside the house from the garage, and fling it into the garage. From his vantage point, Cpl. Kazsuk sees and hears Keith yelling at [REDACTED] and “throwing things around.”

At one point, Keith enters the garage, goes to a desk and pulls out a dark object. Cpl. Kazsuk then clearly saw Keith retrieve a chrome and silver handgun, with a black slide, from the same desk. Cpl. Kazsuk saw Keith “rack” the weapon and move toward the door leading from the garage to the home. Cpl. Kazsuk quickly considered several scenarios of Keith’s intentions, including one in which Keith, clearly angry and armed with a loaded handgun, was going to execute his family inside the house.

Cpl. Kazsuk radioed for emergency backup and told Dispatch that the male was armed with a handgun in the garage. The male then walked toward the doorway leading from the garage to the interior of the home. Cpl. Kazsuk, still standing outside the roll-up garage door, yelled for him to “Stop.” When Keith continued into the home, Cpl. Kazsuk, standing on his tip-toes, fired through the

elevated glass windows of the garage door 6 times, striking the interior garage door and surrounding door frame five times. The sixth round entered the home as Keith opened the garage door that leads from the garage into the house and penetrated drywall next to a bathroom door located across from the interior garage door. The intact bullet was found in the bathroom. No persons were struck by the gunfire. Keith Winn was found lying on the floor, uninjured, and was taken into custody with no further incident. His two handguns were found on the floor near him, both loaded.

INQUIRY OF THE OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING (OVERVIEW):

Training:

Relevant to this incident, Cpl. Kazsuk has completed a 40-hour Domestic Violence Investigations course at the San Diego Regional Training Center, a 40-hour Hostage Negotiations course through California State University, San Jose, and a 24-hour Negotiations for Domestic Violence Course at the San Diego Regional Training Center. He was a crisis negotiator for the Corona Police Department for three years and a member of the Corona Police Department's Domestic Violence Response Team for five months.

Weapon Training/Inspection:

Cpl. Kazsuk successfully qualified with his handgun during the fourth quarter of 2015 range qualifications in December, 2015, the most recent qualifications event prior to this officer involved shooting. The weapon Cpl. Kazsuk used in this officer-involved shooting, a Glock 17, chambered in 9mm, was inspected by Range Master Tarrant on November 22, 2015 (an annual inspection) and cleared for duty.

Conclusion:

The finding of this Administrative Investigation is that Cpl. Kazsuk reasonably perceived a threat of death or serious bodily injury when he saw an angry Keith Winn "rack" a handgun and go into his house where other persons were present, including Keith's wife whom he had just had a physical domestic violence encounter with. Cpl. Kazsuk reacted within the guidelines contained in the Corona Police Department Use of Force Policy section 300.4(b)(1):


"For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes any of the following: 1. The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the officer or another."

District Attorney Findings:

Riverside County District Attorney Michael Hestrin, with the assistance of Deputy District Attorney Elan Zektser, reviewed this incident. District Attorney Hestrin sent a letter to the Corona Police Department on December 10, 2016, noting, "...after a careful review of this incident there is no criminal liability on the part of Cpl. Kazsuk."

This summary report is submitted as the Executive Summary of the Corona Police Department's Administrative Investigation Report for the officer involved shooting incident documented in Corona Police Department Report #16-1380 and may be used by a Use of Force Review Board, in accordance with Department Policy Section 302.

The Administrative Investigation of this Officer-Involved Shooting was conducted in an objective, thorough and unbiased manner.

As a member of the Officer Involved Shooting Team, I was assigned to review the recordings and reports related to this incident. I requested and reviewed all of the Corona Police Department reports of this incident, the available WatchGuard recording of the on-duty officers' response to the incident, the Dispatch audio recordings of the incident, and MDC messages to and from the on-duty Corona Police employees. I reviewed a recording and transcripts of Corporal Kazsuk's voluntary interview. Corporal Kazsuk was the only Corona Police Officer involved in discharging a weapon during this incident.

Corporal Kazsuk's observations and actions during his response and handling of this call were reasonable and appropriate given the circumstances, tactically sound, and within department policy.


A thorough review of this incident revealed no training considerations. The call was appropriately handled by Dispatch personnel and Cpl. Kazsuk was dispatched in a timely manner with accurate information that was updated during his response. Cpl. Kazsuk exercised appropriate tactics in his response, recognized a deadly threat, applied the appropriate response, and, with the assistance of his backing officers, secured the suspect. Officers responding to the resulting call for emergency assistance were restrained and within policy, based on the WatchGuard video I viewed. Recordings indicated that Cpl. Kazsuk, assisting officers and supervisors were concerned for the suspect's physical well-being and that of the suspect's family.



DISPATCH SUMMARY:

On Wednesday, February 3, 2016, at about 0044 hours, Dispatcher Alyssa Kinney was working in the Corona Police Department Communications Center when she received a wireless transfer call from the Riverside Police Department. The Riverside Police Department Dispatcher said he was transferring a call from 1729 Greenview Avenue. The caller, 15 year-old [REDACTED] reported that her dad was yelling at her mom. She then said her mother and father were fighting with their hands and her father had her mother “pinned down.” The caller identified her mother as [REDACTED] and her father as Keith Winn during her conversation with Corona Police Department Dispatcher Kinney.

[REDACTED] described Keith as a black male adult wearing a black shirt. She also said there has been domestic violence between the two of them before. [REDACTED] was locked in her bedroom with her 12 year-old brother and 8 year-old sister. She said that [REDACTED] and Keith were downstairs, in the garage. She could hear her mom crying and did not know of any weapons in the house. At 0049 hours, [REDACTED] said she had to go and disconnected the call.

Cpl. Ryan Kazsuk (Designator “315” / Morning Watch), K9 Officer Carlos Gutierrez (Designator “K93 / Morning Watch) and Officer Stephen Renstrom (Designator “321 / Morning Watch) were dispatched to this call. Cpl. Kazsuk arrived on-scene first, at 0049, followed by Officer Gutierrez and Officer Renstrom. A few minutes after his arrival, Cpl. Kazsuk radioed that the parties were still arguing in the garage. Within a minute of that broadcast, he put out a request for a Code-3 (emergency response with lights and sirens) back-up officer (although Officer Gutierrez and Officer Renstrom were already on Greenview, approaching on foot), stating that a male was armed with a handgun in the garage. About 20 seconds later, Cpl. Kazsuk reported an officer-involved shooting and asked for paramedic assistance.

Sergeant Todd Gottfried (Designator “S15” Morning Watch / Relief Watch Commander) acknowledged the officer-involved shooting broadcast. Sergeant Steve Sears (Designator “S9” / Morning Watch Supervisor) responded to the scene. At 0100 hours, Cpl. Kazsuk radioed the subject was detained and apparently uninjured. Sergeant Paul Gamache (Designator “S18” / Cover Watch

Supervisor) responded to the scene and, once the subject was detained, radioed for all units to reduce their Code-3 (lights and siren) response. Sergeant Skip Shatford (Designator "S27" / Morning Watch Supervisor) also responded to the scene. Sgt. Gamache drove Keith Winn, the person whom Cpl. Kazsuk saw in the garage with the handguns, to the Corona Police station at 0111 hours for booking. The remainder of information related to Dispatch involves routine assignments of crime scene security and requests for other resources related to an officer-involved shooting call-out. A search warrant was later written by Sr. Det. Bloomfield and a search of the home was completed by Sr. Det. Voorhees with Forensic Technician L. Walker assisting. All Corona Police Department personnel left the Greenview address at about 1345 hours on February 3, 2016.

FACTS OF THE INCIDENT:

On Wednesday, February 3, 2016, at about 0044 hours, Corporal Kazsuk was working his regular-duty shift, Morning Watch, when he was dispatched to this domestic violence call at 1729 Greenview Avenue. He was driving Unit #79259.

Cpl. Kazsuk arrived at about 0049 hours and was the only officer on-scene at the time. He noticed an empty Mason jar in the street in front of 1729 Greenview and approached the garage door. Seeing the interior of the garage was lit, he looked through one of the windows along the top of the garage door. Cpl. Kazsuk saw an African-American female in her underwear, standing near the door that leads from the garage to the house. He also saw a male, later identified as Keith Winn, in the garage, wearing dark clothing. Cpl. Kazsuk saw Keith angrily tear a panel off a furnace that was just inside the house from the garage, and fling it into the garage. From his vantage point, Cpl. Kazsuk sees and hears Keith yelling at [REDACTED] and "throwing things around."

At one point, Keith went to a desk in the garage and retrieved a dark object (which turned out to be a firearm) that Cpl. Kazsuk could not see enough to know it was a firearm at the time. Cpl. Kazsuk then clearly saw Keith retrieve a second handgun (chrome and silver), with a black slide, from the same desk. Cpl. Kazsuk saw Keith "rack" the second weapon and move toward the door leading from the garage to the home, holding both guns. Cpl. Kazsuk quickly considered several scenarios of Keith's intentions, including one in which Keith, clearly angry and armed with a loaded handgun, was going to execute his family inside the house. Cpl. Kazsuk radioed for emergency backup and told Dispatch that the male was armed with a handgun in the garage. The male then walked toward the doorway leading from the garage to the interior of the home. Cpl. Kazsuk, still standing outside the roll-up garage door, yelled for him to "Stop." When Keith continued into the home, Cpl. Kazsuk, standing on his tip-toes, fired through the elevated glass windows of the garage door 6 times, striking the interior garage door and surrounding door frame five times. The sixth round entered the home as Keith opened the garage door that leads from the garage into the house and penetrated drywall next to a bathroom door located across from the interior garage door. The intact bullet was found in the bathroom. No persons were struck by the gunfire.

Cpl. Kazsuk, with assisting officers, forced entry into the home and handcuffed Keith who was lying on the floor after the shots were fired. Cpl. Kazsuk radioed that an officer-involved shooting occurred after making entry into the home and securing Keith. Officers recovered the two firearms Keith was holding when the officer-involved shooting happened. Both handguns were loaded. A Taurus 9mm handgun with a magazine capacity of seven rounds, which was fully loaded, was next to the second

handgun, a Smith and Wesson .40 caliber, loaded with nine rounds in a 14-round capacity magazine. No bullets were chambered in either gun when they were inspected by Det. Voorhees.

SUSPECT'S TOXICOLOGICAL & CRIMINAL CASE INFORMATION

Keith's Bio-Tox blood results showed a Blood-Alcohol Content of .07%, with cannabinoids detected, following a blood draw about three hours after his arrest. His blood was also tested for the expanded immunoassay drug screen, including amphetamines, cocaine, opiates and PCP.

Keith was prosecuted by the Riverside County District Attorney's Office for the following charges:

1. PC 243(e)(1), Spousal/Cohabitant Battery
2. PC 236, False Imprisonment
3. PC 148(a), Delay/Resist a Police Officer – all misdemeanor charges.

On July 7, 2016, Keith pleaded guilty to one count of PC 243(e)(1) and received a sentence of 22 days in a work release program, enrollment in a 52-week domestic violence program and summary probation. The other two charges were dismissed as a result of a plea agreement with the Riverside County District Attorney's Office.

INTERVIEW OF CORPORAL RYAN KAZSUK:

Cpl. Kazsuk, accompanied by Attorney Russell Perry, provided a voluntary statement to Det. Mario Hernandez and Detective Jesse Jurado in the Corona Police Department Chief's Conference room on February 4, 2016, at about 1619 hours.

Cpl. Kazsuk said he was working the "graveyard" shift, from 1800 hours-0630 hours, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, when this incident occurred. He has been a Detective Trainee, served on the Officer Involved Shooting Team and had other collateral duties, namely, Explorer Advisor, during his 18 years as a Corona Police Officer. He was working his regular duty shift when he received the call at 1729 Greenview Avenue.

When dispatched to the domestic violence call on Greenview, Cpl. Kazsuk responded from the area of the main police station. Cpl. Kazsuk said, due to the late hour and the fact that a third party, a child, made the call, he believed the information received was likely accurate. While on the way to the call, he received update information that a person was being pinned down which, to Cpl. Kazsuk, escalated this incident and his concern for the well-being of the people in the home. He is aware that traffic stops and domestic violence are among the most dangerous incidents for law enforcement to be involved in. When he arrived and saw the Mason jar in the street in front of the only house with lights on, he realized that someone could have thrown that at someone else during an argument. While awaiting his backup officers in the shadows near the Greenview home, he heard a loud bang, possibly a door slamming, and decided to investigate that.

As he approached the home, Cpl. Kazsuk confirmed he was at 1729 Greenview by looking at the address numbers on the curb. He was able to rise up on his toes and look through glass panes along the top of the roll-up garage door to see inside the lit garage. By doing so, he was able to see all the way through the garage to the pedestrian door that leads from the garage to the interior of the

home. He saw an African-American or Hispanic female standing near the pedestrian door in her underwear. He also saw an African-American man wearing dark-colored sweat clothes, "...yelling and being loud," in the garage. He saw the male throw something further into the garage that appeared to be a panel from the furnace located near the interior door. Cpl. Kzsuk also heard him yell something to the woman that sounded like, "They don't know..." Cpl. Kzsuk saw the male throw some other things around the garage that did not hit the female. It was clear to Cpl. Kzsuk that the male was angry with the female, given his actions and how he was yelling at her. Cpl. Kzsuk was watching through the window when he saw the male approach Cpl. Kzsuk's position, apparently unaware of Cpl. Kzsuk's presence because the garage was lit and Cpl. Kzsuk was in the shadows. When he came to within about 5 feet of Cpl. Kzsuk (still on the other side of the roll-up garage door), the male went to a desk where he began to handle firearms, instantly causing Cpl. Kzsuk to become alarmed.

At first, the male handled a dark-colored object that Cpl. Kzsuk could not clearly see. When the male retrieved the second object, Cpl. Kzsuk was able to see that it was clearly a handgun, either a Glock or a Smith & Wesson. The presentation of that gun prompted Cpl. Kzsuk to be fearful that something bad was about to happen (P.13, line 564 of the transcript). Cpl. Kzsuk watched the male "rack" this gun that he described as having a silver or chrome slide on a black frame. At that point, he radioed that a male is armed with a handgun and he broadcast the code for an emergency back-up response. Cpl. Kzsuk said he first had the thought, since the male is in the garage, that they may be able to surround the house, get the female out and then call the suspect out to them. When the male began walking through the garage, toward the interior of the home, armed with the gun he just appeared to have chambered a round in, Cpl. Kzsuk then thought, "...he's gonna kill this woman..." He also told investigators, "And it just instantly, I'm like, hey, this person is a threat. He's acting badly. You know, something ugly's gonna happen." He expressed concern that the woman or his fellow officers would be hurt dealing with the armed man.

Cpl. Kzsuk said he realized that at some point other officers had arrived, likely when he was busy focusing on the man with the gun. When the man with the gun faced away from Cpl. Kzsuk and started walking toward the house, Cpl. Kzsuk noted that he was walking "...with a purpose." As a former hostage negotiator, Cpl. Kzsuk is aware that people who are considering doing something bad will often hesitate, pace, and do other stalling-type behaviors while building up their courage to act. Cpl. Kzsuk said the man with the gun did not do anything like that – he walked purposefully toward the house. Thinking that the family was about to be executed, Cpl. Kzsuk, on his tiptoes, raised his handgun over his head and fired through the glass at the armed man. While talking about this to the investigators, Cpl. Kzsuk then recalled that, prior to firing, he shouted, "Stop!" Cpl. Kzsuk said that any normal person would be curious about what is going on and would stop and look. The man with the gun did not. For that reason, Cpl. Kzsuk said, "...I knew he knew I was a cop," (after shouting at the suspect to stop with no response). Cpl. Kzsuk said he knew his backdrop was the door of the house which is better than other things it could be. Cpl. Kzsuk told investigators, "That's all I had at that moment in time. He then gets in the house. I stop shooting."

Cpl. Kzsuk and Officer Gutierrez then forced entry through the front door of the home. Cpl. Kzsuk said he was expecting a gunfight when they entered and he was resolved to, "...do whatever we gotta do to save people and ourselves." They found the man lying on the floor about 10 to 15 feet inside the house, immobile. They repeatedly asked the man if he was shot and he did not answer.

Officer Gutierrez and Cpl. Kzsuk carried him outside where the man suddenly became animated and started cursing at them. When Sgt. Sears and Sgt. Shatford arrived, Cpl. Kzsuk briefly told them what he did and asked about the kids in the home. He also remembered telling Sgt. Shatford and Sgt. Sears that he thought the armed man was going to kill the woman he saw. At that point Cpl. Kzsuk left the scene and returned to the police station.

INQUIRY OF THE OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING:

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE:

I reviewed Corporal Kzsuk's training records. Relevant to this incident, Cpl. Kzsuk has completed a 40-hour Domestic Violence Investigations course at the San Diego Regional Training Center, a 40-hour Hostage Negotiations course through California State University, San Jose, and a 24-hour Negotiations for Domestic Violence Course at the San Diego Regional Training Center. He was a crisis negotiator for the Corona Police Department for three years and a member of the Corona Police Department's Domestic Violence Response Team for five months.

Since Cpl. Kzsuk's hire date in 1997, his training records reflect successful completion of numerous Use of Force/Force Options training and simulator sessions, building search training, Active Shooter training, Firearms training and simulator sessions, and Arrest and Control training. He promoted to Corporal in May, 2006, prompting his separation from the Domestic Violence Response Team.

Cpl. Kzsuk successfully qualified with his handgun during the fourth quarter of 2015 range qualifications in December, 2015, the most recent qualifications event prior to this officer involved shooting.

The weapon Cpl. Kzsuk used in this officer-involved shooting, a Glock 17, chambered in 9mm, was inspected by Range Master Tarrant on November 22, 2015 (an annual inspection) and cleared for duty.

ANALYSIS:

Cpl. Kzsuk's knowledge of the dynamics of domestic violence incidents, given his advanced training on that topic and 18 years of police officer experience at the time of this incident, combined with the information he received from Dispatch while on his way to the call, all appeared to have been factors in his decision-making process as he handled this call. Keith Winn's wife later told investigators that Keith had never spoken in a derogative, angry manner about the children in arguments with her before, and, just before the officer involved shooting, she was in the process of gathering her children to leave the house out of fear for their safety. Even though Cpl. Kzsuk did not have that particular information at the time, he came to a similar conclusion about Keith's state of mind. Cpl. Kzsuk knew he needed to stop Keith from getting to his family, based on information he knew from the initial call into Dispatch, and what he saw and heard during his brief time on-scene. Cpl. Kzsuk believed that Keith was a serious threat to his family's safety after seeing him arguing with his wife, throwing objects around the garage, and retrieving what turned out to be two handguns. This belief resulted in Cpl. Kzsuk's efforts to stop Keith from having access to the other occupants of the home while armed.

Considerations for any intentional weapon discharge by a police officer include an evaluation of the reasonableness of the officer's perceptions and response, a review of pre-shooting tactics (to determine if the officer played any role in creating the emergency that led to the officer-involved shooting), and whether or not the application of force was an appropriate way to address the threat.

Cpl. Kzsuk's early actions in this incident did not precipitate the officer-involved shooting since the facts support that Cpl. Kzsuk was called to, and then reacted to, an emergency that developed in his presence. Keith was likely not even aware that Cpl. Kzsuk was watching him as demonstrated by Keith's actions at the time of the incident (retrieving and manipulating firearms) and by his statement later to investigators. Cpl. Kzsuk believed Keith to be a threat to others in the home and fired his weapon to stop Keith from getting to them. While it is true that another family member could have emerged in the line of fire during the officer involved shooting, Cpl. Kzsuk, outside of a closed roll-up garage door, had no means other than his firearm to stop Keith from advancing, armed and angry, on the other occupants of the home. Cpl. Kzsuk shouted, "Stop!" prior to firing his duty weapon, with no apparent effect.

Current active shooter training requires that officers on-scene should not wait for the arrival of additional officers to address a serious threat. Cpl. Kzsuk's decision to gather intelligence by quietly approaching the house alone initially (although Officer Gutierrez arrived within a few minutes after Cpl. Kzsuk arrived), was an appropriate and common tactic. It is fortunate Cpl. Kzsuk did that, given what he saw Keith doing in the garage. Allowing Keith to enter the home would have, at a minimum, allowed for an armed, barricaded threat, with potential shooting victims and/or hostages, given Keith's behavior leading up to the moment of the officer-involved shooting.

CONCLUSION

The statement provided by Cpl. Kzsuk and the report written by (Canine) Officer Gutierrez, the second officer on-scene at this call and who was present during the officer-involved shooting, are consistent with the statements of all of the involved parties and the physical evidence documented at the scene.

The finding of this Administrative Investigation is that Cpl. Kzsuk reasonably perceived a threat of death or serious bodily injury when he saw an angry Keith Winn "rack" a handgun and go into his house where other persons were present, including Keith's wife whom he had just had a physical domestic violence encounter with.

Cpl. Kzsuk reacted within the guidelines contained in the Corona Police Department Use of Force Policy section 300.4(b)(1):





"For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes any of the following: 1. The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the officer or another."

This administrative inquiry is based on my objective review of the facts and statements contained in the reports and recordings related to this incident. Cpl. Kazsuk's actions while handling this call were within department policy and procedures.

Riverside County District Attorney Michael Hestrin, with the assistance of Deputy District Attorney Elan Zektser, have reviewed this incident. District Attorney Hestrin sent a letter to the Corona Police Department on December 10, 2016, noting, "...after a careful review of this incident there is no criminal liability on the part of Cpl. Kazsuk."

DISPOSITION:

This report is submitted as the Corona Police Department's Administrative Investigation Report for the Officer Involved Shooting incident that occurred on February 3, 2016, documented under Corona Police Department case #16-1308, and may be used by a Use of Force Review Board, in accordance with Department Policy Section 302.
